VILLAGE WORKING TO OPEN FUTURE VILLAGE HALL PARK (Former Woodbine Golf Course) UP FOR PASSIVE RECREATIONAL USE

The Village organization is working hard to get the future Village Hall Park (Former Woodbine Property) open for the public to enjoy for passive recreational opportunities. At the Village Board's next meeting on September 9th, we will establish the date for the opening.

When the future village hall park property is opened for passive recreation, residents will be able to enjoy a small open-air picnic area as well as a 1.2 mile walking path. Walking dogs, on leash, will be allowed. The passive recreational park property will be opened from dusk to dawn, while the Village plans for, and constructs (starting in 2016) regional stormwater improvements on the property. Also, the park will remain open for passive use as the community moves forward with planning the design and use of this park property.

BUSINESS IS GOING GREAT AT BIG R IN HOMER GLEN!

JULY SHERIFF'S OFFICE REPORT – 98.79% OF VEHICLES COUNTED IN JULY WERE DRIVING LEGALLY AND SAFELY

Lieutenant Mark Fisch, of the Will County Sheriff's Office, released his monthly report for July, summarizing police activity in Homer Glen. During July, the Sheriff's Office had 433 total incidents.

The Sheriff's Office continues to address complaints from Homer Glen residents regarding what some perceive to be an increase in speeding vehicles throughout the area. When a resident reports speeding vehicles to the Sheriff's Office, a "Traffic Complaint Form" is completed and forwarded to the Patrol Division for any possible enforcement action. Sheriff Deputy Toong spent considerable time in July, enforcing traffic laws at locations where the Sheriff's Office has received complaints from residents regarding speeding or disregarding traffic control devices. **From the 1,409 vehicles observed at various traffic complaint locations, only 1.21% of the vehicles were found to be committing a traffic violation and 98.79% of the drivers counted were driving legally and safely. In an effort to further address the various speeding and traffic complaints that have recently been generated, an extra Sheriff's Deputy has been assigned to the Homer Glen Policing Unit. As scheduling allows, this Sheriff's Deputy's primary responsibility will be traffic enforcement. **Will County Sheriff's Office July Report Attached.**

JULY, 2015 TRAFFIC DATA

The following chart includes specific information regarding some of Deputy Toong's traffic details. As stated in the usual portion of the Monthly Report, Dep. Toong spent 42 hours conducting these details. A total of 158 vehicles were stopped and issued either a written citation, written warning or given a verbal warning from the 14,388 vehicles he counted. That reflects 1.10% of the vehicles he counted were committing a traffic offense, 98.9% of the commuting public were driving legal and safe.

Dep. Toong also spent time in July, enforcing traffic laws at locations we have received complaints from citizens, regarding speeding or disregarding traffic control devices. The following is a summary at those location:

Hadley Rd. east of S. Bell Rd. (speeding vehicles)

3:25 Hours 10 Tickets 1 Written Warning 590 Vehicles Counted

Birchdale Ln. (speeding vehicles)

70 Minutes 0 stops 36 Vehicles Counted

Parker Rd. and Chi-Bloom (stop sign violations)

2:30 Hours 2 Tickets 0 Warnings 672 Vehicles Counted

12200 Block of Lady Barr Ln. (Speeding vehicles and stop sign violations)

2:35 Hours 4 Tickets 0 Warnings 111 Vehicles counted

From the 1,409 vehicles counted at these "complaint" locations, 1.21% of the vehicles counted were committing a traffic violation, 98.79% were driving legal and safe.

In an effort to further address the various speeding/traffic complaints that were recently generated in the Village, as scheduling allowed, an extra Deputy was assigned to the Homer Glen Policing Unit. When that occurred, that Deputy's primary responsibility was traffic enforcement. This detail began near the end of July. Scheduling allowed for 3 shifts to have an extra Deputy for this detail in July (9 to date in August).

During the 3 details in July, the extra Deputy spent time at the locations we received citizen generated traffic complaints, including, but not limited to, Crystal Lake Dr., Lady Bar Ln. and Birchdale Dr. The Deputies issued 9 traffic tickets and 3 written warnings while working these details.

WILL COUNTY SHERIFF'S POLICE ACTIVITY SUMMARY July 2015

Overview

During the month of July, the Sheriff's Office had 433 incidents. During the month, 20 calls for service involved assisting ambulances and 58 calls for service involved Deputies responding to business or residential alarms. From the 58 alarm responses, 45 were determined to be false alarms and the owners were issued a False Alarm Notice. The Sheriff's Office effected 10 arrests on 15 different charges including, but not limited to the following: 1 for "Burglary", 3 for "Domestic Battery", 1 for, "DUI", 2 "Probation Violations", 2 for "Driving While License is Suspended/Revoked", and 1 for "Retail Theft".

During the month of July, for crime prevention reasons, Sheriff's Office personnel continued to attend various meetings and gatherings that involve the Senior Citizens who reside in Homer Glen. Deputies also continued to meet with classes at A-Orland Driving School.

Dep. Williams and Dep. Kudla were each assigned a newly hired Deputy for several weeks in July for Field Training. Between both, 240 additional hours were performed in the Village at no additional cost. Leading up to, and including the July 4th weekend, the Will County Sheriff's Office Traffic Division was able to secure a grant from IDOT for seatbelt enforcement throughout the County. On July 1st, a total of 4 hours were allocated to Bell Rd. between 143rd and 159th Streets in Homer Glen for this campaign. Again, these additional hours were of no cost to the Village.

Similar to many towns and villages, Homer Glen residents have been observing what they perceive as an increase in speeding vehicles throughout the area. When this is reported to the Sheriff's Office, we complete a "Traffic Complaint Form". Information including location and times are included on this form. The complaint is then assigned to Deputy Toong and the Patrol Division for any possible enforcement action. This same action is performed throughout the Sheriff's Offices' jurisdiction. The Village of Homer Glen receives approximately the same amount of complaints for speeding as any other area throughout the County. A separate report will be included with July's and August's monthly reports, detailing how much time is designated to these complaints and the results from the details. The excel report will be Deputy Toong's monthly report showing most of the areas he spends his time in an attempt to slow vehicular speeds. These areas are predetermined based on several factors. Not on that spreadsheet is his time spent on the traffic complaints from citizens.

The second document goes in depth how much time was given by all the personnel assigned to the Homer Glen Policing Unit for traffic enforcement. It is a lengthy report, but proves the Sheriff's Office takes traffic complaints seriously and will spend a considerable amount of time addressing them. By including these reports for a couple months, we hope to clarify the steps the Sheriff's Office takes to reduce the amount of speeding vehicles.

Traffic Overview

During July, Deputy Toong issued 145 tickets, 12 written warnings, and 1 verbal warning during his traffic enforcement details in the Village. Deputy Toong spent 42 hours conducting these details in locations where we have received traffic complaints and other locations we have determined to have a higher percentage of traffic violations. A total of 14,388 vehicles were counted during these details. These figures show 1.10% of the total vehicles counted were committing a traffic violation. That means 98.9% of the commuting public was driving legal and safe.

In total, Dep.Toong issued 175 tickets, 16 written warnings and 1 verbal warning in the Village during the month of July.
