

Draft FY 2016-17 Budget Now Available for Review

Finance Director Sawyers presented the proposed budget for FYE 2017 at the March 23 Village Board meeting. The budget document illustrates the Village's projected revenues, operating and capital expenditures and expected fiscal year end projections for the budget period.

A public hearing on the proposed FY 2016-17 budget will be held at 7:00p.m. on Wednesday, April 13 during the Village Board meeting held at 14917 S Founders Crossing. The Village Board will then consider approval of the proposed annual budget at their meeting on April 27, 2016.

The annual budget is adopted by ordinance and serves as the legal document that provides staff the authority to expend Village funds. Lastly, the budget document includes the Village's goals, and policies as approved by the Village Board.

Yard Waste Pickup Begins April 1

Yard waste pickup by the Village's refuse provider will begin April 1 and continue through November 30th on resident's regularly scheduled pickup day.

- Yard waste season is April 1st – November 30th each year.
- Grass clippings, leaves, branches, etc. are considered yard waste (no dirt or rock).
- Based on an Illinois State Law, yard waste must NOT be mixed with your garbage.
- Yard waste can be placed in brown paper yard waste bags.
- Yard waste can also be placed in your own 32-gallon cans. A red “yard waste only” sticker must be attached to any can you are using for yard waste so that the driver can identify them properly. Contact our residential accounts department to request these free stickers.
- Large (95 gallon) yard waste carts on wheels are also available. The 1st yard waste cart is included with your service, additional carts are available to rent. See our online order form section to the left.
- Branch Pickup: Branches should be cut into 3 – 4 foot lengths and be no wider than 6 inches in diameter. Branches can be placed in the yard waste bag or put in reasonable sized bundles tied with twine or string.

The Village has notified its Landlord and Property Manager of its “Intent to Terminate the Lease Agreement” at its current location by July 31, 2016.

International Dark Sky Week

The **attached** proclamation designates April 4 – 10, 2016 as International Dark Sky Week in the Village of Homer Glen. International Dark Sky Week was created in 2003 by a high-school student, Jennifer Barlow, in Midlothian, Virginia. The week's popularity has grown every year and is endorsed by the International Dark Sky Association. It is a week when people are encouraged to turn out their lights in order to observe the beauty of the night sky.

The goals of the week are to:

- Temporarily reduce light pollution and raise awareness about its effects on the night sky,
- Encourage the use of better lighting systems that direct light downward instead of into the sky, and,
- Promote the study of astronomy.

The Village of Homer Glen has recognized the night sky as a natural resource and has actively promoted the preservation of the night sky through an outdoor lighting ordinance, past participation in Earth Hour, and hosting Stargazing events at Trantina Farm. In 2011, the Village became an International Dark Sky community. Proclaiming April 4 – 10, 2016 as International Dark Sky Week is an opportunity for the Village to support and raise awareness for the need to continue to appreciate and protect a beautiful and valuable resource.

Village Seasonal Employment Opportunities

The Village of Homer Glen is seeking to fill two full-time seasonal maintenance worker positions. Under the supervision of the Facilities Manager, this position maintains grounds of public property by performing the following duties: mows lawns, removes brush, trims and edges around walks, removes damaged leaves, branches, or twigs. Clears leaves and cleans grounds. Repairs fences, gates, walls, paints fences, signs etc. Cleans out drainage ditches and culverts and other duties as requested or assigned which are within the scope of the above duties.

Applicants must be 18 years of age, have a H.S. diploma or GED and possess a valid driver's license. Pay rate is \$10 per hour for approximately 40 hours per week from April 18 to October. Selected candidates will be required to pass a criminal background check, medical physical and drug screen.

**A Proclamation Designating April 4 -10, 2016
as International Dark Sky Week in the Village of Homer Glen**

Whereas, created in 2003, International Dark Sky Week has grown to become a worldwide event and a key component of Global Astronomy Month; and

Whereas, the nighttime environment is a crucial natural resource for all life on Earth, but the glow of uncontrolled outdoor lighting has hidden the stars, changing the nighttime environment; and

Whereas, before the advent of electric light, our ancestors experienced a night sky brimming with stars that inspired science, religion, philosophy, art and literature; and

Whereas, the common heritage of a natural night sky is rapidly becoming unknown to the newest generations; and

Whereas, we are only just beginning to understand the negative repercussions of losing this natural resource; and

Whereas, the Village of Homer Glen has become known for Stargazing since 2008 and educating the public on dark sky awareness; and

Whereas, the Village of Homer Glen, the Fourth International Dark Sky Community in the world, supports International Dark Sky Week.

Now Therefore, Be It Proclaimed by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Homer Glen, that April 4-10, 2016 is designated as International Dark Sky Week in the Village of Homer Glen, Illinois.
