The meeting was called to order on December 10, 2025 by Mayor Neitzke-Troike at 6:30 p.m. in the Village Board Room, 14240 W. 151<sup>st</sup> Street, Homer Glen.

**I. PUBLIC COMMENT -**

1. Sue Steilen – Homer Township Supervisor. Looking for community input on what the public would like to see the big red building used for. There is a survey with three simple questions.
2. Tracy Beaman – Homer Glen resident. Present for variance.
3. Heidi Pacella – Mentioned that Homer Glen was one of the safest communities and some residents are questioning the need for flock cameras. She stated that while license plate readers can help investigate crimes, these systems create mass data collection that raises Fourth Amendment and civil liberties concerns. Ms. Pacella mentioned that flock cameras collect and analyze large amounts of data that can turn ordinary behavior into suspicion. Despite claims that they don't collect personal information, license plate data can be linked to individuals. She shared that flock has already admitted to improper data sharing, and some cities have recently ended their contracts due to security and legal concerns. Residents are asking the village to slow down, seek independent legal review, and wait for stronger safeguards and legislation before moving forward.
4. Lisa Mikolajczak - Supports the use of Flock cameras as a proactive public safety tool. She mentioned they argue that data privacy concerns are minimal since tracking already occurs through everyday technology. Based on personal experiences—including attempted home break-ins, vehicle thefts, slow emergency response times, and a serious incident involving an armed individual—she believes Flock cameras would have helped identify and apprehend suspects more quickly. They were also concerned that a camera near their neighborhood was removed without clear public input. Overall, she believes Flock cameras complement police work, help protect residents, and should be maintained or expanded in the interest of safety.
5. Erin Kennealy – supports the idea of surveillance cameras only after legal and policy issues are resolved. She currently opposes them due to privacy concerns and potential rights violations, and the risk of lawsuits, but acknowledged the need to protect victims.
6. Tim McGraw - longtime Homer Glen resident, spoke against the proposed Flock AI surveillance system, emphasizing that residents overwhelmingly rejected it in a 2023 vote. He argued the system goes far beyond basic license plate readers, using AI to track vehicles, movements, associations, and daily routines without warrants or probable cause, raising serious Fourth Amendment concerns. He warned that the data would be owned and controlled by a private company, not the village, making it

vulnerable to misuse, sale, or hacking. McGraw concluded that adopting the system would violate constitutional freedoms, undermine public trust, and disregard the will of the community.

Trustee Reynders motioned to grant McGraw an additional three minutes, second by Trustee Muller.

Mr. McGraw continued. He mentioned that Flock owns the surveillance data, so the city cannot comply with FOIA requests, and courts have ruled this data is public record. McGraw said cities nationwide that tried similar systems have faced lawsuits, canceled contracts, and legal fees. Flock's nationwide network allows any law enforcement agency to access cameras without a warrant or oversight, putting civil liberties at risk. He mentioned Homer Glen is already very safe, with minimal crime, making such a system unnecessary. Residents have rejected it, the system is unconstitutional, and giving up liberty for a false sense of security is unacceptable.

**Village Manager Baber** – Thanked staff for all their hard work on the Homer for the Holidays event held this past Saturday. Thanked the Public Works department for their hard work on keeping streets clean during inclement weather. Wished everyone a Joyous Holiday season.

**Trustee Holzhauser** – Great job by Public Works on snow removal and great job by staff on Homer for the Holidays.

**Trustee Lepore** – commented on the success of the dining coupon booklet that ran through October to November. He felt this was a huge win for Homer Glen and local restaurants. Mentioned that restaurant week will run January 27, 2026 – February 10, 2026.

**Trustee Mason** – Wished everyone a Merry Christmas. Congratulated Fire Chief Dave Bricker on his promotion. Thanked Lt. Pete Piazza and the Will County Sheriff department for keeping us safe. Traffic tickets are down. Thanked Public Works for the endless efforts to keep our streets safe and clean.

**Trustee Reynders** – Invited everyone to the January 14, 2026 Village Board meeting to see the presentation given by the Lakota Group on the 1<sup>st</sup> phase of Heritage Park. Thanked Director Woods and his department for their work on snow removal. Congratulated Dave Bricker on his promotion. Thanked everyone for all their hard work for Homer for the Holidays, thanked the vendors and especially Mr. Konow for donating donuts and hot cider.

**Trustee Muller** – Mentioned that Public Works did a fantastic job on the snow removal and all their efforts.

**Trustee Schaller** – Agreed with Trustees that Public Works did a great job with snow removal. And a great job on Homer for the Holidays.

**Village Clerk** – Wished everyone a very Merry Christmas and Happy New Year. Gave a shout out to the Lockport Township High School Varsity Football team who made it to the Elite 8 in the 8A IHSA State Finals and defeated the number 2 seed Barrington High School team with a 35-0 victory. The Varsity Porters then fell short in the final four against Oswego losing 10-7.

**Village Attorney** – Mr. Pasquinelli said the Village had a productive meeting with Illinois American Water about creating a required franchise agreement for their use of Village right-of-way and property. This follows an ordinance passed about sixty days ago requiring such agreements. IAW is expected to provide a draft agreement in early January, and updates will follow.

**Mayor Neitzke-Troiike** – Mentioned that she had received a call right before the meeting that a resident in the Village of Homer Glen experienced a home invasion in which two suspects entered a residence, held a woman at gunpoint, robbed the home, and stole her vehicle. Residents were urged to remain aware of their surroundings, especially when arriving home during the holiday season.

Appreciation was expressed to the Ability Awareness Committee for providing a sensory-friendly hour at the Homer for the Holidays event, promoting inclusivity for individuals with sensory sensitivities.

Public Works was also commended for their prompt and effective response during recent snowfall, and residents were thanked for their patience and understanding.

6. Motion to approve an Ordinance Amending Section §83-54.1(A) of the Village Code Licensing and Regulating Video Gaming Within the Village of Homer Glen, Will County Illinois.

Trustee Schaller motioned to approve, Trustee Mason second.

Discussion – Trustee Schaller stated the one year waiting period for video gaming licenses, adopted in April 2024, is unnecessary because businesses already undergo lengthy local and state licensing and background checks. The additional delay puts local establishments at a competitive disadvantage, especially compared to surrounding communities. The Village previously removed this waiting period without negative effects and the Administration & Finance Committee unanimously recommended its repeal.

Trustee Mason – stated this was voted 4-0 in favor in A&F.

7. Motion to approve a Proposal from Flock Safety for twelve license plate cameras, solar power, wireless network, installation, poles, and cloud hosting in the amount of \$57,150.00 and the annual subscription of \$49,500.00 for a total of \$106,650.00.

Trustee Schaller motioned to approve, Trustee Muller second.

Discussion – Trustee Schaller motioned to submit two letters for the record. Mayor Neitzke-Troiike asked for unanimous consent. He asked respectfully for unanimous consent to make both items part of the official record for Agenda Item L.7 and directed the Village Clerk to attach them to the meeting minutes as exhibits.

Trustee Schaller stated the first letter is dated November 24, 2025, a letter of support from the Orland Park Police Chief Eric Rossi regarding FLOCK Safety’s LPR technology. Trustee Schaller stated, “I move to receive and file this letter and to include it as a supplemental document to Agenda Item L.7, attached to the minutes as Exhibit 1.”

The second is an email received by the board today at 2:54pm from resident Carol Lindee. Trustee Schaller stated, “I move to receive and file that email and to include it as a supplemental document to Agenda Item L.7, attached to the minutes as Exhibit 2.”

Mayor Neitzke-Troiike stated hearing no objection, both documents are made part of the record.

Trustee Schaller expressed support for adopting License Plate Reader (LPR) technology, citing over 28 years of law enforcement experience and he emphasized its effectiveness in solving and preventing crime when paired with strict safeguards. Trustee Schaller mentioned that Illinois law limits LPR use and exempts data from FOIA, and the Village can impose stronger local controls, including limited access by the Will County Sheriff’s Office, required law enforcement purpose for searches, auditing, and a short retention period with automatic deletion. Trustee Schaller stated the prior advisory referendum opposing LPR was acknowledged and respected, but it was noted that laws, policies, and expectations around privacy and data governance have evolved. He stated that moving forward now would reflect lessons learned by implementing stronger guardrails, transparency, and oversight.

Trustee Schaller described LPR as a public-safety tool – not traffic enforcement or general surveillance – that captures license plate information and basic vehicle descriptors, not driver identity. He said with proper governance, it helps close gaps used by criminals moving between communities. Trustee Schaller concluded that a properly regulated LPR program balances public safety, privacy, and fiscal responsibility and urged approval of the resolution to help keep the community safe.

Trustee Muller – stated license plate reader systems have proven to be an effective crime deterrent and investigative tool. He gave recent examples including solving a \$30,000 porch pirate theft using limited video evidence, identifying vehicles involved in ATM and gaming machine burglaries across the region, and alerting agencies when suspect vehicles enter a community— often causing criminals to move on due to increased police presence. Trustee Muller stated that beyond crime prevention, LPRs have been instrumental in locating missing or endangered individuals, including Alzheimer’s patients. He mentioned that criminals are now actively avoiding areas with LPRs, further demonstrating their effectiveness. Trustee Muller stated “overall, these systems have significantly benefitted law enforcement and the residents they serve.”

Trustee Reynders – stated that as trustees, our responsibility is to protect the safety of our residents. She said that while our village is generally safe, even one crime is too many. Trustee

Reynders stated that “I’ve personally seen the lasting trauma caused when armed criminals stole a car at gunpoint from a friend and her children—an experience that still affects them today.”

Trustee Reynders mentioned that if we can prevent even one crime, it could save a life or remove a dangerous criminal from our streets. She acknowledged that some residents may have privacy concerns, but we have a chief and sergeant on this board to ensure proper rules and safeguards are in place to protect residents’ information.

“One crime prevented is worth the effort, and that prevention could save someone’s life.”

Trustee Mason - supports adopting proactive public safety measures. He emphasized the importance of preventing crime before residents become victims. He referenced a recent armed robbery and hostage situation in Homer Glen as evidence that serious crime can happen locally despite the community’s reputation for safety. Trustee Mason noted that surrounding municipalities already use this technology and that Homer Glen is a gap on the map. He stated that law enforcement officials have indicated suspects in recent crimes would likely already be in custody if the system were in place. He expressed confidence that officers would use the tool responsibly, citing accountability and personal experience, and concludes that the measure would help protect residents, including cases involving violent crime or missing elderly individuals.

Trustee Lepore – motioned to table L.7, there was no second. The motion failed.

Trustee Lepore stated, “that I cannot support Flock cameras in Homer Glen. The residents recently rejected the system in a referendum, and as trustees, our decisions should reflect their will. Constant surveillance is an overreach of government power and goes against the principles Americans expect from their leaders.”

Trustee Holzhauser – Stated he was initially undecided due to the 2023 advisory referendum, but after considering recent updates and Trustee Schaller’s points, he supports taking proactive action to protect citizens and sees the cost as reasonable.

Mayor Neitzke-Troike asked the attorney to weigh in on questions she had previously asked in regards to lawsuits and privacy concerns. Attorney Pasquinelli mentioned other towns like Oak Park and Evanston had issues with ALR camera systems due to unauthorized sharing of data, not the technology itself. He stated that Illinois law, specifically the Illinois Trust Act, strongly limits such sharing. Mr. Pasquinelli mentioned that courts generally allow limited, short-term license plate tracking for law enforcement, distinguishing it from more invasive, prolonged surveillance. The key is strict protocols and narrow use to stay legally compliant.

Trustee Reynders – wanted to add that this is something we also need to take into consideration – “we may be one of the safest, but we are also a target here.”

8. Motion to approve an Ordinance Prohibiting the Possession, Marketing, and Sale of Kratom, in any of its forms, to Minors.

Trustee Mason motioned to approve, Trustee Muller second.

Discussion – Trustee Mason stated the village has been reviewing kratom sales in local stores and while kratom in its natural form is considered relatively safe and can help with pain and PTSD, problems arise when it's mixed with synthetic compounds that are addictive. The proposed regulation aims to:

- Restrict kratom sales to adults 21 and over.
- Prevent marketing that appeals to children (e.g., candy or cereal-style packaging).
- Ensure only the natural form is sold, avoiding harmful additives.

The goal is to balance adult use for legitimate purposes with protection for minors.

Trustee Muller – agreed with everything Trustee Mason stated and said that Trustee Mason has been working on this for quite some time.

Trustee Schaller – stated that it should be regulated.

Trustee Reynders – gave kudos to Trustee Mason for all the research and work he has put into this.

Mayor Neitzke-Troiike stated she asked for this to be placed on old business. The topic: Community Development Committee – Status and Leadership. Mayor Neitzke-Troiike stated the committee is currently vacant after Trustee Steilen left. Trustees Schaller and Holzhauser currently have no committee assignments:

- Schaller expressed interest in chairing the Community Development Committee.
- Holzhauser expressed interest in joining a committee.

Mayor Neitzke-Troiike mentioned that Dan Kenney, a committee member, also expressed interest in chairing, but appointments follow: Trustees → Staff → Residents.

The Mayor would like to see the committee's focus shift toward community recognition programs (e.g., Officer of the Year, Business of the Year, student/athlete recognition).

- Meetings are not yet scheduled; dates/times are flexible to accommodate trustees.
- Next step discussed: Decide trustee participation, appoint a chairperson, set meeting schedule, and define committee initiatives.

Trustee Reynders motioned to appoint Trustee Schaller as the Chair of the Community Development Committee, appoint Madam Clerk as the Co-Chair and appoint Trustee Holzhauser as a committee member, second by Trustee Mason.

Trustee Reynders – also wanted to mention for the record that the strip mall in which her restaurant is located, was broken into several years ago along with a few other businesses and FLOCK cameras could have helped then.

Thank you for your continued partnership and for your commitment to safeguarding the residents of Homer Glen.

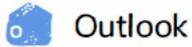

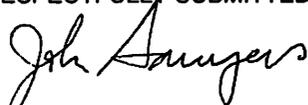

## Standard Terms and Conditions

1. Term. The term of this Agreement shall be three (3) years from the date signed by you, the Customer. This Agreement shall automatically renew for additional one (1) year terms unless canceled in writing by either party no less than thirty (30) days written notice prior to the end of the then-current term.
2. Price Increases. (a) Increase in Property Size. Because the size of your property is a significant factor in determining the cost of TruGreen's services, TruGreen may increase the specified charges proportionally to reflect any additional costs incurred should you add property under this Agreement (b) Fuel, Material and Labor Cost Increases. Because the product, labor and fuel costs constitute a significant portion of TruGreen services, TruGreen may increase the price hereunder in the event of a cost increase in any of these areas. Similarly, TruGreen may experience cost increases as a result of other unforeseen circumstances, including, but not limited to changes in government regulation, etc. To offset cost increases based on any of these issues, TruGreen shall provide you thirty (30) days written notice prior to any such necessary price adjustment, including a statement of the associated reason. If you do not object in writing to the price adjustment within such thirty (30) day period, the Agreement shall continue thereafter at the adjusted price. If you object, you and TruGreen will enter into a ten-day good-faith negotiation period. If a mutually acceptable solution cannot be reached during such ten-day period, either party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice. (c) Annual Price Increases. Client and ILM waive all rights of subrogation against each other and any of their subcontractors, suppliers, agents and employees, each of the other for damages caused by fire or other causes of loss to the extent covered by property insurance or other insurance applicable to the work specified in the Proposal.

**Damages and Non-Target Areas.** ILM will make every effort to minimize any damage to areas surrounding the area where the work specified in the Proposal will be conducted ("Non-Target Areas"). Prescribed burning or herbicide applications to tall vegetation or hard to reach areas increase the possibility of damage to Non-Target Areas. Client accepts the inherent risk of damages to Non-Target Areas and ILM shall not be responsible for damages to Non-Target Areas. Further, ILM shall not be obligated to remediate damages to Non-Target Areas unless ILM has specifically agreed to do so in the Proposal. ILM will remediate any damage caused to Non-Target Areas due to ILM's negligence or improper execution of services at no cost to the Client. Client is responsible for the removal and replacement of personal property, improvements, fixtures, appliances, or other obstacles in the area where the work specified in the Proposal will be conducted unless otherwise specified in the Proposal. **Lien Notice.** As required by local state lien laws, ILM hereby notifies Client that as a furnisher of labor and/or materials for improvement on the Property ILM has lien rights against the Property if not paid.

**Termination.** Either party may terminate the Contract for cause only, upon not less than ten (10) days written notice if the other party fails to substantially perform in accordance with the terms of this Contract through no fault of the terminating party, provided that the terminating party has provided the non-terminating party with written notice of the non-performance and non-terminating party has failed to cure the non-performance within ten (10) days of receipt of the

notice. If Client terminates the Contract Client agrees to compensate ILM for all work performed by ILM, and materials utilized by ILM prior to the date of termination and to compensate ILM for mobilization fees, labor, material costs, and clerical time incurred thereafter.

**Interpretation and Enforcement.** This Contract shall not be modified except by written agreement signed by both Client and ILM. Duties and obligations imposed under this Contract and rights and remedies available hereunder shall be in addition to and not a limitation of duties, obligations, rights and remedies otherwise imposed or available by law. No action or failure to act by ILM shall constitute a waiver of a right afforded under this Contract, nor shall such action or failure to act constitute approval of or acquiescence in a breach hereunder. The award rendered by the arbitrators shall be final, and judgment may be entered on it in accordance with applicable law in any court having jurisdiction thereof. Demand for arbitration shall be made in writing and served on the other party with copies sent to the American Arbitration Association.

**Force Majeure.** ILM shall not be considered to be in default or breach of this Contract, and shall be excused from performance or liability for damages incurred by Client, if and to the extent ILM shall be delayed in or prevented from performing or carrying out any of the provisions of this Contract due to any act, omission, or circumstance by or in consequence of any act of God, labor disturbance, vandalism, sabotage, failure of suppliers of materials, act of the public enemy, war, invasion, insurrection, riot, terrorism, civil disorders, strikes, rebellions, revolutions, fire, storm, flood, ice, earthquake, explosion, epidemic, pandemic, virus, disease, breakage or accident to machinery or equipment or any other cause or causes beyond ILM's reasonable control, including any curtailment, order, regulation, or restriction imposed by governmental, military or lawfully established civilian authorities.

**Background Information:** In November, Public Works Director Brent Woods and Public Services and Safety Chairman Curt Mason attended a Zoom meeting with Urban SDK for a demonstration of their software platform. This platform focuses on delivering comprehensive traffic speed and traffic volume datasets for all Village roadways, including percentile speeds, AADT, VMT, functional classification data, and platform access for a minimum of three users. Data refresh cycles are defined, with speed data updated daily and volume data updated annually with a one-year historical archive, supporting traffic calming, safety analysis, planning, and operational decision-making.

We currently have numerous traffic study requests through the first 3 months of spring/summer 2026 and it is anticipated that the number of requests will continue to increase throughout the year. This platform will allow us to perform these studies instantly on all roads within Homer Glen during any given period within the previous year. We will be able to create traffic and speed data reports year-round rather than just during those limited months acceptable for the placement of the current traffic counter devices on the roadways.

**Budget Implications:** Funds would be used from the current general fund Safety Network line item 10-22-60-210.

Customer acknowledges that the Software Services in source code form is the Confidential Information of Urban SDK and that the source code is not licensed to Customer by this Agreement or any Schedule and will not be provided by Urban SDK. No right or implied license or right of any kind is granted to Customer regarding the Services, including any right to use, reproduce, market, sell, translate, distribute, transfer, adopt, disassemble, decompile, reverse engineer the Software Services or the documentation thereof, or any portions thereof, or obtain possession of any source code or other technical material relating to the Software Services.

## 6. Fees and Payment Terms

6.1. **Services Fees.** For the Services provided under this Agreement, Customer will pay Urban SDK the fees in the amounts set forth on the applicable Ordering Document. Unless otherwise set forth on the applicable Ordering Document, applicable fees will be invoiced to Customer annually in advance and payable (i) immediately upon invoice if Customer’s payment method is on file with Urban SDK, or (ii) if no payment method has been provided to Urban SDK, within thirty (30) days of invoice. Fees are non-cancelable and non-refundable. In the event of early termination of this Agreement other than due to Urban SDK’s breach, all amounts outstanding that would have otherwise been due through the end of the then-current Term shall automatically be due and payable by Customer upon termination.

6.2. **Fee Changes.** After the Initial Term, and at the beginning of each Renewal Term thereafter, Urban SDK may adjust the fees applicable during the upcoming Renewal Term upon written notice provided at least sixty (60) days prior to the end of the Initial Term or applicable Renewal Term, as the case may be. All fees paid and expenses reimbursed under this Agreement will be in United States currency. Urban SDK may increase pricing and fees on an annual basis by the greater of: (a) six percent (6%) per annum, or (b) the percentage by which the then most-recently published Consumer Price Index in the United States for all Urban Consumers (Index base: 1982/1984 = 100; Index Components: All Items) (“CPI”) exceeds the CPI as of the Effective Date or, if later, the immediately preceding change in pricing. Additionally, Upon written notice to Customer at least thirty (30) days prior to effectiveness, Urban SDK may increase the amount of the fees in an Ordering Document relating to, if applicable: (a) data storage and/or relational databases if the applicable cloud data provider has increased the prices paid by Urban SDK for such data storage and/or relational databases, and any such increase shall be proportionate to the increase imposed upon Urban SDK by the applicable utility provider; and (b) the cost of third party Services or services (including software and datasets) performed or provided by a third party that comprise all or some part of the Services including any increases to such costs.

- 6.3. **Late Fees.** Customer will pay a late fee of 1.5% per month (not to exceed the maximum allowed under state law) on all balances not paid when due. Urban SDK, at its option, may suspend the Services, in whole or in part, if Urban SDK does not receive all undisputed amounts due and owing under this Agreement within thirty (30) days after delivery of notice to Customer of the failure to pay such overdue balances.
- 6.4. **Taxes.** The fees and expenses due to Urban SDK as set forth in this Agreement are net amounts to be received by Urban SDK, exclusive of all sales, use, withholding, excise, value added, ad valorem taxes or duties incurred by Customer or imposed on Urban SDK in the performance of this Agreement or otherwise due as a result of this Agreement. This section will not apply to taxes based solely on Urban SDK'S income.
- 6.5. **Offset.** Fees and expenses due from Customer under this Agreement may not be withheld or offset by Customer against other amounts for any reason.

## 7. **Customer Acknowledgements.**

- 7.1. **Customer Requirements.** Customer must have required equipment, software, and Internet access to be able to use the Software Services. Acquiring, installing, maintaining and operating equipment and Internet access is solely Customer's responsibility. Urban SDK neither represents nor warrants that the Software Services will be accessible through all web browser releases. Customer shall take all steps necessary for Urban SDK to perform the Services effectively, including with respect to (a) providing access to Customer's resources or staff as needed to perform the Services; (b) maintaining, testing, configuring, operating, and upgrading Customer's data, applications, server hardware, operating system, environment, and facilities, as applicable, related to the Services.
- 7.2. **Use of Software Services.** Customer shall not and shall not permit others in using the Software Services to: (i) defame, abuse, harass, stalk, threaten or otherwise violate or infringe the legal rights (such as rights of privacy, publicity and intellectual property) of others or Urban SDK; (ii) publish, ship, distribute or disseminate any harmful, inappropriate, profane, vulgar, infringing, obscene, false, fraudulent, tortuous, indecent, unlawful, immoral or otherwise objectionable material or information (including any unsolicited commercial communications); (iii) publish, ship, distribute or disseminate material or information that encourages conduct that could constitute a criminal offense or give rise to civil liability; (iv) engage in any conduct that could constitute a criminal offense or give rise to civil liability for Urban SDK; (v) misrepresent or in any other way falsely identify Customer's identity or affiliation, including through impersonation or altering any technical information in communications using the Software Services; (vi) transmit or upload any material through the Software Services contains viruses, trojan horses, worms, time bombs, cancelbots, or any other programs with the intent or effect of damaging, destroying, disrupting or otherwise impairing Urban SDK, or any other person's or entity's, network, computer system, or other equipment; (vii) interfere with or disrupt the Software Services, networks or servers connected to the Urban SDK systems or violate the regulations, policies or procedures of such networks or servers, including unlawful

or unauthorized altering any of the information submitted through the Software Services; (viii) attempt to gain unauthorized access to the Software Services, other Urban SDK customers' computer systems or networks using the Software Services through any means; or (ix) interfere with another party's use of the Software Services, including any parties Customer has done business with or choose not to do business with through the Software Services. Urban SDK has no obligation to monitor Customer's use of the Software Services. However, Urban SDK may at any time monitor, review, retain and disclose any information as necessary to satisfy or cooperate with any applicable law, regulation, legal process or governmental request. Customer shall use commercially reasonable efforts, including reasonable security measures relating to administrator account access details, to ensure that no unauthorized person may gain access to the Services.

- 7.3. **Compliance with Law.** Customer agrees not to use (and will use its best efforts not to allow its End Users to use) the Software Services for illegal purposes or for the transmission of material that is unlawful, harassing, libelous (untrue and damaging to others), invasive of another's privacy, abusive, threatening, or obscene, or that infringes the rights of others. Customer is solely responsible for any and all improper use of the Software Services that occurs as a direct or indirect result of any act or omission of Customer. Customer will notify Urban SDK immediately of any unauthorized use of the Software Services or any other breach of security that is known or suspected by Customer.
- 7.4. **Professional Services.** With respect to any Professional Services, Customer shall have the following obligations set forth in this Section 7.4.
- a. **Customer Contract Manager.** Customer shall cooperate with Urban SDK in all matters relating to the Professional Services and appoint a Customer employee to serve as the primary contact with respect to this Agreement (the "Customer Contract Manager").
  - b. **Access and Assistance; Customer Materials.** Customer shall provide such access to Customer's premises, facilities, and computer systems and networks as may reasonably be requested by Urban SDK for the purposes of performing the Professional Services. Customer shall respond promptly to any Urban SDK request to provide direction, information, approvals, authorizations or decisions that are reasonably necessary for Urban SDK to perform the Professional Services. Customer shall provide such Customer Materials as set forth in the applicable Statement of Work or as Urban SDK may reasonably request in order to carry out the Professional Services, in a timely manner, and ensure that it is complete and accurate in all material respects.
  - c. **Delay in Performance.** If Urban SDK's performance of its obligations under this Agreement is prevented or delayed by any act or omission of Customer or its agents, subcontractors, consultants or employees, Urban SDK shall not be deemed in breach of its obligations under this Agreement or otherwise liable for any costs, charges or losses sustained or incurred by Customer, in each case, to the extent arising directly or indirectly from

such prevention or delay, and Urban SDK's obligation to perform will be extended based on Urban SDK's reasonable ability to reallocate resources to performing and such delay may result in reasonable additional fees to the extent Urban SDK incurs additional costs due to the delay.

## 8. Non-disclosure and confidentiality.

- 8.1. **Disclosure.** Each party may disclose to the other party certain Confidential Information of such party or of such party's associated companies, distributors, licensors, suppliers, or customers. "Confidential Information" means any information that is of value to its owner and is treated as confidential, including trade secrets, technology, information pertaining to business operations and strategies, and information pertaining to customers, pricing, and marketing; "Disclosing Party" refers to the party disclosing Confidential Information hereunder, whether such disclosure is directly from Disclosing Party or through Disclosing Party's employees or agents; and "Recipient" refers to the party receiving any Confidential Information hereunder, whether such disclosure is received directly or through Recipient's employees or agents.
- 8.2. **Requirement of Confidentiality.** The Recipient agrees: (a) not to disclose or otherwise make available Confidential Information of the Disclosing Party to any third party without the prior written consent of the Disclosing Party, provided that the Recipient may disclose the Confidential Information of the Disclosing Party to its, and its affiliates, officers, employees, consultants and legal advisors who have a "need to know", who have been apprised of this restriction and who are themselves bound by nondisclosure obligations at least as restrictive as those set forth in this Section 8; (b) to use the Confidential Information of the Disclosing Party only for the purposes of performing its obligations or as otherwise authorized under the Agreement; and (c) to promptly notify the Disclosing Party in the event it becomes aware of any loss or disclosure of any of the Confidential Information of Disclosing Party. Customer acknowledges that the Software Services and documentation are the Confidential Information of Urban SDK. The obligations in this Section 8 shall survive termination and continue for so long as the applicable information constitutes Confidential Information. Confidential Information shall not include information that: (a) is already known to the Recipient without restriction on use or disclosure prior to receipt of such information from the Disclosing Party; (b) is or becomes generally known by the public other than by breach of this Agreement by, or other wrongful act of, the Recipient; (c) is developed by the Recipient independently of, and without reference to, any Confidential Information of the Disclosing Party; or (d) is received by the Recipient from a third party who is not under any obligation to the Disclosing Party to maintain the confidentiality of such information.
- 8.3. **Compelled Disclosure.** If the Recipient becomes legally compelled to disclose any Confidential Information, the Recipient shall provide: (a) prompt written notice of such requirement so that the Disclosing Party may seek, at its sole cost and expense, a protective order or other remedy; and (b) reasonable assistance, at the Disclosing Party's sole cost and expense, in opposing such disclosure or seeking a protective order or other limitations on disclosure. If, after providing

such notice and assistance as required herein, the Recipient remains required by law to disclose any Confidential Information, the Recipient shall disclose no more than that portion of the Confidential Information which, on the advice of the Recipient's legal counsel, the Recipient is legally required to disclose and, upon the Disclosing Party's request, shall use commercially reasonable efforts to obtain assurances from the applicable court or agency that such Confidential Information will be afforded confidential treatment.

**8.4. Customer Data; Data Use.** "Customer Data" means information, data and other content, in any form or medium, that is collected, downloaded or otherwise received, directly or indirectly from Customer or an End User by or through the Services, but does not include any data collected, downloaded or otherwise received, directly or indirectly from any other user of the Services. Customer hereby grants to Urban SDK a non-exclusive license to copy, reproduce, store, distribute, publish, export, adapt, edit and translate Customer Data to the extent reasonably required for the performance of Urban SDK's obligations and the exercise of Urban SDK's rights under this Agreement. Customer warrants to Urban SDK that Customer has the right to provide such Customer Data to Urban SDK in accordance with this Agreement. Additionally, Customer agrees that data derived by Urban SDK from Urban SDK's performance of the Services or input by or feedback from Customer may be used for the purposes of analysis, including statistical analysis, trend analysis, creation of data models, and creation of statistical rules. The results of such analysis ("De-identified Data") may be used by Urban SDK for any lawful purpose both during and following the Term. De-identified Data shall not contain any information that identifies or can be reasonably used to identify an individual person or Customer.

## **9. Limited Warranty; Disclaimers.**

Urban SDK represents and warrants that it will provide the Services in a manner consistent with general industry standards reasonably applicable to the provision thereof and that the Software Services will perform substantially in accordance with the documentation under normal use and circumstances. Each party represents and warrants that it has the legal power and authority to enter into this Agreement. OTHER THAN AS EXPRESSLY SET FORTH IN THIS SECTION 9, EACH PARTY DISCLAIMS ALL WARRANTIES, CONDITIONS, OR REPRESENTATIONS TO THE OTHER PARTY REGARDING THIS AGREEMENT, WHETHER ORAL OR WRITTEN, EXPRESS, IMPLIED, OR STATUTORY. WITHOUT LIMITING THE FOREGOING, ANY IMPLIED WARRANTY OR CONDITION OF MERCHANTABILITY, THE IMPLIED WARRANTY AGAINST INFRINGEMENT, THE IMPLIED WARRANTY OR CONDITION OF FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, AND THOSE ARISING FROM A COURSE OF DEALING OR USAGE OF TRADE ARE EXPRESSLY EXCLUDED AND DISCLAIMED BY Urban SDK. NO WARRANTY IS MADE THAT USE OF THE SERVICES WILL BE ERROR FREE OR UNINTERRUPTED, THAT ANY ERRORS OR DEFECTS IN THE SERVICES WILL BE CORRECTED, OR THAT THE SERVICES FUNCTIONALITY WILL MEET CUSTOMER'S REQUIREMENTS. NOTWITHSTANDING ANYTHING TO THE CONTRARY IN THIS AGREEMENT, CUSTOMER ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT URBAN SDK MAKES NO REPRESENTATION OR WARRANTY, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, AS TO ANY THIRD-PARTY HARDWARE, SOFTWARE, PRODUCT OR SERVICE INCLUDED WITH ANY OF THE SERVICES.

## **10. Limitation of Liability**

- 10.1. **Exclusion of Damages.** EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SECTION 10.3, IN NO EVENT WILL EITHER PARTY BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER OR TO ANY THIRD PARTY FOR ANY CONSEQUENTIAL, INCIDENTAL, INDIRECT, EXEMPLARY, SPECIAL OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES, INCLUDING LOSS OF USE, REVENUE, PROFIT, OR DATA, WHETHER ARISING OUT OF BREACH OF CONTRACT, TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE) OR OTHERWISE, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER SUCH DAMAGE WAS FORESEEABLE AND WHETHER OR NOT SUCH PARTY HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES.
- 10.2. **Liability Cap.** EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SECTION 10.3, IN NO EVENT WILL EITHER PARTY'S LIABILITY ARISING OUT OF OR RELATED TO THIS AGREEMENT, WHETHER ARISING OUT OF OR RELATED TO BREACH OF CONTRACT, TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE) OR OTHERWISE, EXCEED THE AGGREGATE AMOUNTS PAID OR PAYABLE TO Urban SDK PURSUANT TO THIS AGREEMENT DURING THE TWELVE (12) MONTH PERIOD PRECEDING THE EVENT GIVING RISE TO THE CLAIM.
- 10.3. **Exceptions.** The exclusions and limitations in Section 10.1 and Section 10.2 shall not apply to: (a) damages or other liabilities arising out of or relating to a party's failure to comply with its obligations under Section 8 (Non-Disclosure and Confidentiality); or (b) a party's obligations under Section 11 (Indemnification).

## 11. Indemnification

- 11.1. **Urban SDK Indemnification.** Urban SDK shall defend Customer and its officers, directors, employees, agents, successors and permitted assigns against any third party claim, suit, action or proceeding (each, an "Action") based on a claim that Customer's receipt or use of the Services in accordance with this Agreement infringes any intellectual property right or misappropriates any trade secret of a third party, and shall pay all settlements entered into and damages awarded against Customer to the extent based on such an Action; provided, however, that Urban SDK shall have no obligations under this Section 11.1 with respect to claims to the extent arising out of: (a) any instruction, information, designs, specifications or other materials provided by Customer to Urban SDK; (b) use of the Services in combination with any materials or equipment not supplied to Customer or specified by Urban SDK in writing; or (c) any modifications or changes made to the Services by or on behalf of any person or entity other than Urban SDK. If the Services, or any part thereof, become, or in the opinion of Urban SDK may become, the subject of a claim of infringement or misappropriation, Urban SDK may, at its option: (i) procure for Customer the right to use such Services free of any liability; (ii) replace or modify the Services to make them non-infringing; or (iii) terminate this Agreement and refund to Customer any portion of the fees prepaid by Customer for the infringing Services.
- 11.2. **Customer Indemnification.** Customer shall defend Urban SDK and its officers, directors, employees, agents, affiliates, successors and permitted assigns against all Actions based on a claim that any information or materials provided by Customer (including Customer Data), or Urban SDK's receipt or use thereof, infringes any intellectual property right or misappropriates any trade secret of a third party, and shall pay all settlements entered into and damages awarded against Urban SDK to the extent based on such an Action.

11.3. **Indemnification Procedures.** The party seeking indemnification hereunder shall promptly notify the indemnifying party in writing of any Action and cooperate with the indemnifying party at the indemnifying party's sole cost and expense. The indemnifying party shall immediately take control of the defense and investigation of such Action and shall employ counsel of its choice to handle and defend the same, at the indemnifying party's sole cost and expense. The indemnifying party shall not settle any Action in a manner that adversely affects the rights of the indemnified party without the indemnified party's prior written consent, which shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. The indemnified party's failure to perform any obligations under this Section 11.1 shall not relieve the indemnifying party of its obligations under this Section 11.1 except to the extent that the indemnifying party can demonstrate that it has been materially prejudiced as a result of such failure. The indemnified party may participate in and observe the proceedings at its own cost and expense.

## 12. TERM AND TERMINATION.

12.1. **Initial Term.** This Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and shall continue in full force and effect for the initial term set forth on the applicable Ordering Document ("Initial Term"), unless earlier terminated as provided for below. Thereafter, except with respect to any Statements of Work (which shall expire in accordance with their terms), the Initial Term shall automatically renew for successive periods of one (1) year each (each a "Renewal Term" and together with the Initial Term, the "Term"), unless either party provides written notice to the other party at least 30 days prior to the end of the then-current Initial Term or Renewal Term of its intent to not renew the Agreement.

12.2. **Termination.** Without prejudice to any other remedies and in addition to any other termination rights herein, the parties shall have the right to terminate this Agreement as provided below:

- a. By either party if the other party commits a material breach of this Agreement and such breach remains uncured 30 days after written notice of such breach is delivered to such other party including the failure to pay any fees due to Urban SDK; or
- b. By either party if the other party makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or commences or has commenced against it any proceeding in bankruptcy, insolvency, or reorganization pursuant to bankruptcy laws, laws of debtor's moratorium or similar laws.

12.3. **Termination of Statement of Work.** Either party may terminate any outstanding Statement of Work without terminating the entire Agreement if the other party commits a material breach of such Statement of Work and such breach remains uncured 30 days after written notice thereof is delivered to the other party.

12.4. **Effect.** Upon termination of this Agreement for any reason, all rights and licenses granted by Urban SDK hereunder to Customer will immediately cease. Customer must retrieve all of its data from the Software Services within thirty (30) days of

the termination or expiration of this Agreement, at which time Urban SDK reserves the right to delete all data.

- 12.5. **Survival.** Termination of this Agreement or any Schedule will not affect the provisions regarding Urban SDK's or Customer's treatment of Confidential Information, provisions relating to the payments of amounts due, indemnification provisions, provisions limiting or disclaiming Urban SDK's liability, or any other terms which by their nature should survive, which provisions will survive such termination.

### 13. GENERAL

- 13.1. **Governing Law.** This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the internal laws of the State of Florida without giving effect to any choice or conflict of law provision or rule. Jurisdiction and venue for purposes of any litigation in connection with this Agreement will be in the relevant federal or state court located in Jacksonville, Florida.
- 13.2. **Conflicting Terms.** Notwithstanding the content of any Customer purchase order or any other document or record, whether in writing or electronic, relating to the subject matter of this Agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall govern and any conflicting, inconsistent, or additional terms contained in such documents shall be null and void.
- 13.3. **Notice.** All communications required or otherwise provided under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed given when delivered (i) by hand, (ii) by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested; or (iii) by a nationally recognized overnight courier service; to the address set forth on the applicable Ordering Document, as may be amended by the parties by written notice to the other party in accordance with this Section 13.3.
- 13.4. **Assignment.** Neither party may assign, transfer or delegate any or all of its rights or obligations under this Agreement, without the prior written consent of the other party, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed; provided that upon prior written notice to the other party, either party may assign the Agreement to an affiliate of such party or to a successor of all or substantially all of the assets of such party through merger, reorganization, consolidation or acquisition. No assignment shall relieve the assigning party of any of its obligations hereunder. Any attempted assignment, transfer or other conveyance in violation of the foregoing shall be null and void. This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assigns.
- 13.5. **Interpretation.** For purposes of this Agreement, (a) the words "include," "includes" and "including" shall be deemed to be followed by the words "without limitation"; (b) the word "or" is not exclusive; and (c) the words "herein," "hereof," "hereby," "hereto" and "hereunder" refer to this Agreement as a whole. Should any provision of this Agreement require judicial interpretation, the parties agree that the court interpreting or construing the same shall not apply a presumption

that the terms of this Agreement shall be more strictly construed against one party than against another.

- 13.6. **Severability.** In case any one or more of the provisions of this Agreement should be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions contained herein shall not in any way be affected or impaired thereby.
- 13.7. **Attorneys' Fees.** In the event that any action, suit, or other legal or administrative proceeding is instituted or commenced by either party hereto against the other party arising out of or related to this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover its reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs from the non-prevailing party.
- 13.8. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties concerning the subject matter hereof and supersedes all written or oral prior agreements or understandings with respect thereto.
- 13.9. **Amendment; Waiver.** This Agreement may only be amended, modified or supplemented by an agreement in writing signed by each party hereto. No waiver by any party of any of the provisions hereof shall be effective unless explicitly set forth in writing and signed by the party so waiving. Except as otherwise set forth in this Agreement, no failure to exercise, or delay in exercising, any rights, remedy, power or privilege arising from this Agreement shall operate or be construed as a waiver thereof; nor shall any single or partial exercise of any right, remedy, power or privilege hereunder preclude any other or further exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right, remedy, power or privilege.
- 13.10. **Force Majeure.** Neither party shall be liable for delay or failure in performing any of its obligations hereunder due to causes beyond its reasonable control, including an act of nature, war, natural disaster, governmental regulations, terrorism, communication or utility failures or casualties or the failures or acts of third parties.
- 13.11. **Equitable Relief.** Each party acknowledges that a breach by a party of Section 3.2 (Restrictions) or Section 8 (Non-Disclosure and Confidentiality) may cause the non-breaching party irreparable damages, for which an award of damages would not be adequate compensation and agrees that, in the event of such breach or threatened breach, the non-breaching party will be entitled to seek equitable relief, including a restraining order, injunctive relief, specific performance and any other relief that may be available from any court, in addition to any other remedy to which the non-breaching party may be entitled at law or in equity. Such remedies shall not be deemed to be exclusive but shall be in addition to all other remedies available at law or in equity, subject to any express exclusions or limitations in this Agreement to the contrary.
- 13.12. **No Third-Party Beneficiaries.** This Agreement is for the sole benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assigns and nothing herein, express or implied, is intended to or shall confer upon any other

person or entity any legal or equitable right, benefit or remedy of any nature whatsoever, under or by reason of this Agreement.

- 13.13. **Relationship of Parties.** Nothing in this Agreement shall constitute or be deemed to constitute a partnership between the parties hereto or constitute or be deemed to constitute one party as agent of the other, for any purpose whatsoever, and neither party shall have the authority or power to bind the other, or to contract in the name of or create a liability against the other, in any way or for any purpose.
- 13.14. **Publicity.** While this Agreement is in effect, Customer grants Urban SDK the right to use Customer's logo and name on Urban SDK's website and promotional materials. Customer shall have the right to require Urban SDK to terminate any such uses at any time by written notice to Urban SDK.
- 13.15. **Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall be deemed to be one and the same agreement. A signed copy of this Agreement delivered by facsimile, e-mail or other means of electronic transmission shall be deemed to have the same legal effect as delivery of an original signed copy of this Agreement

## Support Services Schedule

### Support Service Responsibilities

Urban SDK shall provide support services (collectively, "Support Services") for the Software Services in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule. The Support Services are included in the Software Services, and Urban SDK shall not assess any additional fees, costs or charges for such Support Services.

Urban SDK shall use commercially reasonable efforts to:

- correct all failures of any Software Services to be available or otherwise perform in accordance with this Agreement ("Service Errors") in accordance with the Support Service Level Requirements, including by providing defect repair, programming corrections and remedial programming;
- provide unlimited telephone support during the hours of 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Eastern Time on business days;
- provide unlimited online ticket support outside business hours and on weekends;
- Provide online access to technical support bulletins and other user support information and forums, to the full extent Urban SDK makes such resources available to its other customers; and
- Respond to and resolve Support Requests.

### Service Monitoring and Management

Urban SDK shall use commercially reasonable efforts to continuously monitor and manage the Software Services to enable Availability that meets or exceeds the Availability Requirement.

### Service Maintenance

Urban SDK shall use commercially reasonable efforts to maintain the Software Services in order to enable Availability that meets or exceeds the Availability Requirement. Such maintenance services shall include using commercially reasonable efforts to provide to Customer:

- all updates, bug fixes, enhancements, new releases, new versions and other improvements to the Software Services, that Urban SDK provides at no additional charge to its other similarly situated customers; and

### **Support Requests**

Customer shall notify Urban SDK of Support Requests by email, telephone or such other means as the parties may hereafter agree to in writing.

### **Support Request Classification**

#### **Description:**

Any Service Error Comprising or Causing any of the Following Events or Effects

#### **Critical Service Error**

- Issue affecting entire system or single critical production function;
- System down or operating in materially degraded state; or
- Widespread access interruptions.

#### **High Service Error**

- Primary component failure that materially impairs its performance; or
- Data entry or access is materially impaired on a limited basis.

#### **Medium Service Error**

- Software Services are operating with minor issues that can be addressed with a work around.

#### **Low Service Error**

- Request for assistance, information, services that are routine in nature, or updates that are desired but do not impair system operation or functionality.

### **Escalation**

With respect to any Critical Service Error Support Request, until such Support Request is resolved, Urban SDK shall escalate that Support Request within sixty (60) minutes of the receipt of such Support Request by the appropriate Urban SDK support personnel.

### **Corrective Action Plan**

If two (2) or more Critical Service Errors occur in any thirty (30) day period during (a) the Term or (b) any additional periods during which Urban SDK does or is required to perform any Software Services, Urban SDK shall promptly investigate the root causes of these Service Errors and provide to Customer within five (5) business days of its receipt of notice of the second such Support Request an analysis of such root causes and a proposed written corrective action plan for Customer's review, comment and approval, which, subject to and upon Customer's written approval, shall be a part of, and by this reference is incorporated in, this Agreement as the parties' corrective action plan (the "**Corrective Action Plan**"). The Corrective Action Plan shall include, at a minimum: (x) Urban SDK's commitment to Customer to devote the appropriate time, skilled personnel, systems support and equipment and other resources necessary to resolve and prevent any further occurrences of the Service Errors giving rise to such Support Requests; (y) a strategy for developing any programming, software updates, fixes, patches, etc. necessary to remedy, and prevent any further occurrences of, such Service Errors; and (z) time frames for implementing the Corrective Action Plan. There will be no additional charge for Urban SDK's preparation or implementation of the Corrective Action Plan in the time frames and manner set forth therein.

### **Termination Rights**

If (i) four (4) or more Critical Service Errors occur during a single thirty (30) day period, (ii) eight (8) or more High Service Errors or Critical Service Hours (combined in any combination) occur during a single thirty (30) day period, (iii) eight (8) or more Critical Service Errors occur during a six (6) month period, or sixteen (16) or more High Service Errors or Critical Service Hours (combined in any combination) occur during a six (6) month period, in addition to all other remedies available to Customer, Customer may terminate this Agreement on written notice to Urban SDK with no liability, obligation or penalty to Customer by reason of such termination.

**A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING HERITAGE CIRCLE WITH THE HONORARY STREET NAME “ZEMKE WAY,” IN RECOGNITION OF LOU ZEMKE’S PUBLIC SERVICE AND CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE VILLAGE**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Homer Glen (the “Village”), Will County, Illinois, is a home rule municipality in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the “Home Rule Powers”); and

**WHEREAS**, the Village desires to recognize residents who have made significant contributions to the Village community, State of Illinois, and our great nation; and

**WHEREAS**, the President and Board of Trustees believe that the designation of Honorary Street Names, in recognition of significant contributions and service, is in the best interest of the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, honorary street names do not alter the legal names of streets and roadways, but serve as a symbolic recognition of public service to both the local community, and nation as a whole; and

**WHEREAS**, Heritage Circle is a public roadway located within the Village of Homer Glen; and

**WHEREAS**, Lou Zemke has made substantial contributions to both the Village community and our great nation, through his dedicated and tireless service as the Commander of American Legion Post 2011, and his selfless service to our nation in the United States Army; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village desires to recognize Mr. Zemeke’s public service and community contributions by designating an Honorary Street name in his honor;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Homer Glen, Will County, Illinois, as follows:

**Section 1: Incorporation of Recitals.** The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

**Section 2: Honorary Designation.** Heritage Circle is hereby designated with the Honorary Street name “Zemke Way” in honor of Lou Zemke’s public service and substantial contributions to the Village community and our nation. The Honorary “Zemke Way” designation shall in no way change or otherwise impact the official or legal street name of Heritage Circle for addressing, emergency response, or postal purposes.

**Section 3: Officers/Officials authorizations.** The Village Manager and his designees, are hereby authorized and directed to take all necessary actions to implement

this Resolution, including the procurement of all necessary labor and materials for the installation of the Honorary street sign.

**Section 4: Authorized Size and Color.** The Honorary street sign shall be substantially the same size and shape of the existing “Heritage Circle” street sign, but shall be brown in color with white lettering.

**Section 5: Severability.** The various provisions of this Resolution are hereby expressly declared to be severable, and the invalidity of any specific provision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

**Section 6: Repealer.** All Ordinances and Resolutions or specific provisions of Ordinances and Resolutions previously passed or adopted by the Village of Homer Glen, that conflict with any provision of this Resolution, are hereby repealed solely to the extent of any such conflict.

**Section 7: Effective Date.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

**Background Information:** Cervantinos went before the board on August 28, 2024, for a Class A Liquor License (Restaurant with Service Bar.) It was later found that Cervantinos should have a Class B Liquor License (Restaurant and Bar.) The only difference for Cervantinos between the two licenses is highlighted below:

***Class A: Restaurant with Service Bar.***

- (1) A restaurant license authorizes the retail sale, for consumption on the license premises, of alcoholic liquor by the drink or vinous beverages by the bottle or carafe, or beer or margaritas by the pitcher of a capacity not to exceed 60 ounces.*
- (2) Service of alcoholic liquor shall be only during the time that food is being served, and a full menu is in effect.*
- (3) The license shall only be available for premises defined as a "restaurant" herein containing a minimum area of 1,000 square feet.*
- (4) All such liquor service shall be from a service bar only; said bar shall not be available for customer use.*
- (5) Restaurant licenses shall be issued only to restaurants that have dining facilities as stated.*
- (6) The annual fee for a Class A license shall be \$2,000.*

***Class B: Restaurant and Bar.***

- (1) A restaurant and bar license authorizes the retail sale, for consumption on the licensed premises, of alcoholic liquor by the drink for consumption on the premises, and beer and vinous beverages by the bottle or carafe, or beer or margaritas by the pitcher of a capacity not to exceed 60 ounces.*

*(2) Service of alcoholic liquor shall be only during the time that food is being served, and a full menu is in effect.*

*(3) The license shall only be available for premises defined as a "restaurant" herein containing a minimum area of 1,000 square feet.*

*(4) The annual fee for a Class B license shall be \$2,000.*

Cervantinos would like to terminate their Class A liquor license and the next item on the agenda is asking the board to increase the number of Class B liquor licenses by one, so that they can be issued the correct liquor license.

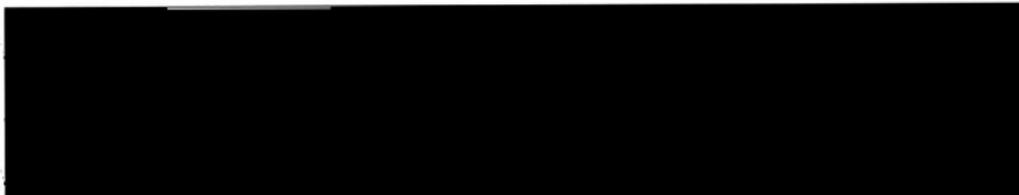

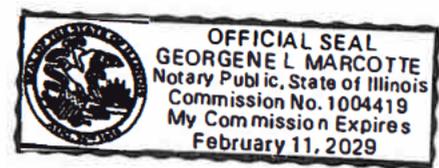

**Background Information:** Cervantinos opened on July 26, 2024. On August 28, 2024, Mr. Karl Evans went before the Board for a Class A (Restaurant with Service Bar) Liquor License. He is also here today to fix his current liquor license to a Class B (Restaurant & Bar) Liquor License. Mr. Evans was approved for his state video gaming license, and it was issued on December 11, 2025. Cervantinos is 4,434 square feet. Attached are the video gaming application, along with pictures of where the gaming terminal devices will be placed in the restaurant.

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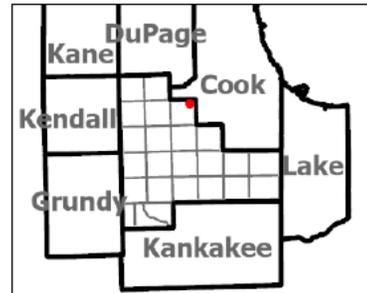
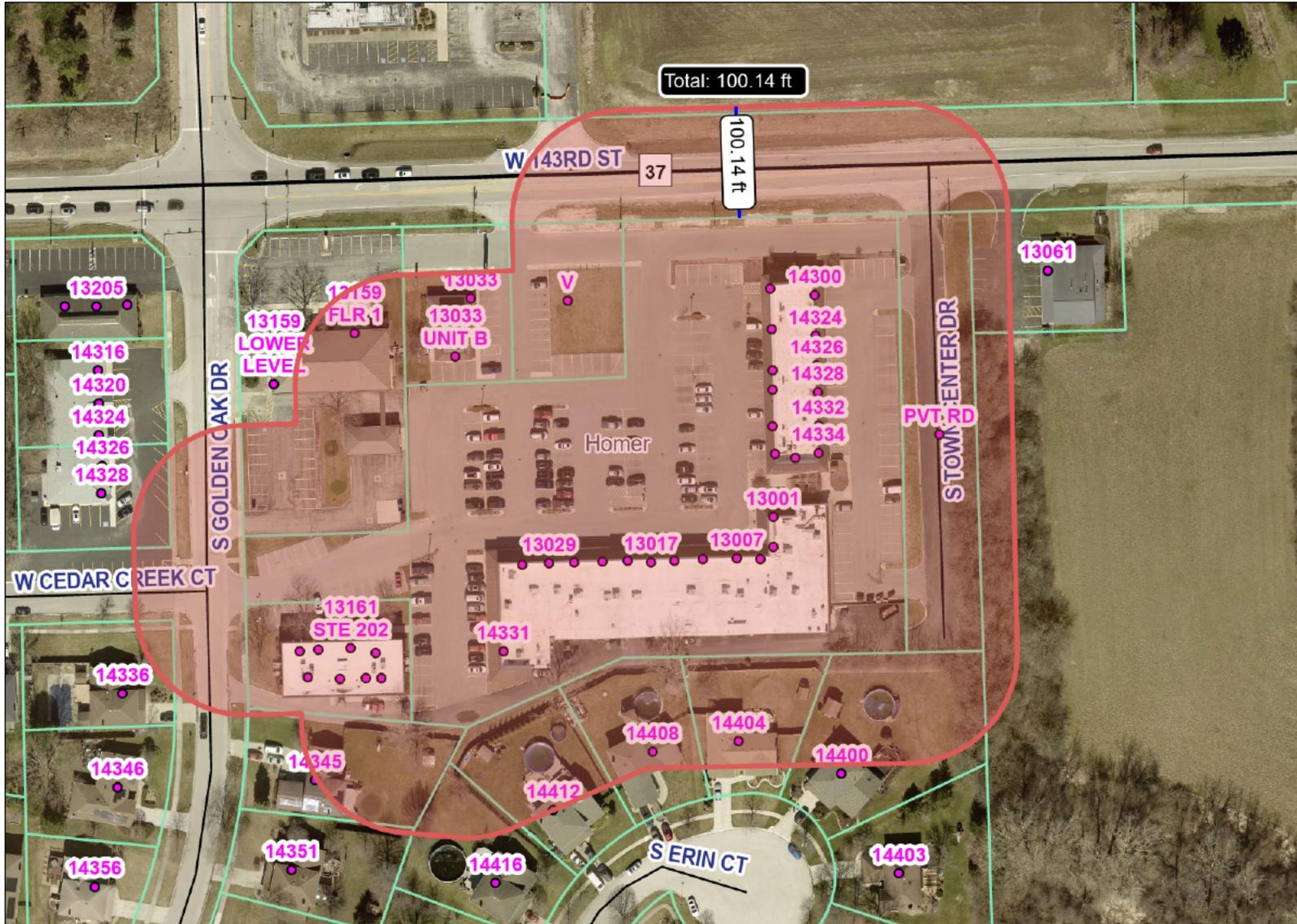
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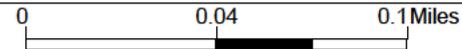

Bell Road, Homer Glen, Illinois (PIN: 16-05-01-301-026-0000) [HG-2529-PUD].

**Motion for Consideration:** Is there a motion to Approve an Ordinance conditionally approving [1] a Major Change to a PUD with exceptions, [2] a Special Use for a drive-through use, [3] a Special Use 24-hour operation, and [4] Site Improvement Plans for certain real property located in the C-3 General Business District at 14025 S. Bell Road, Homer Glen, Illinois, subject to the following conditions [HG-2529-PUD]?

1. Meet all final engineering and building code requirements.
2. All landscape areas shall have living ground cover or mulch, as noted per the Landscape Plan. There shall be no use of stone or gravel as the top layer of landscaping material.

**General Note:**

The applicant, on behalf of Chase Bank, has reapplied for nearly identical requests that were denied by the Village Board (4-2) on September 10, 2025 under case HG-2515-PUD. The Zoning Ordinance does not have a waiting period to reapply for Special Use Permit requests after denial by the Board. The Ordinance does have a one-year waiting period for map amendment (rezoning) requests, but that doesn't apply to this case. Since the previous request was denied by the Board, it effectively "completed" the case. With the applicant's reapplication, a new case number was assigned, new application fees were paid and all property owners within 250' were notified by mail. The only change to the plans is to the proposed architecture and building materials. As proposed, the two stone columns (pilasters) on the front of the building would be removed and replaced with fiber cement panels. Also, the fiber cement paneling is changing to a slightly darker gray on the rear (east) side of the building. This change was made after the public hearing held by the Plan Commission.

**Plan Commission Recommendation**

At the public hearing on December 4, 2025, the Plan Commission reviewed the proposal for Chase Bank and recommended *unanimous approval* of the three (3) special use permit requests

and the site improvement plans. This recommendation was different than their previous recommendation on August 7, 2025, which was 4-2 in favor of the Major Change to the PUD and 5-1 in favor for the other 3 motions. An excerpt from the meeting minutes from December 4, 2025, has been attached to this supplement sheet.

### **Public Testimony**

Public testimony at the public hearing was provided by Jonathan Krissoff, Market Director of Real Estate for Chase Bank. This public testimony is contained within the approved meeting minutes from December 4, 2025.

### **Public Comment**

None received for this resubmitted case.

### **Code Enforcement**

There are no outstanding code enforcement cases.

### **Background Information**

The applicant, Christopher J. Sanz with Orion Real Estate Group, is proposing to repurpose the former Chili's restaurant for a Chase Bank. Chase Bank currently has a location within the Jewel-Osco building across the street within the Homer Town Square shopping plaza. The subject property covers Lot 5 and a small portion of the northern side of Lot 6 within the Goodings Grove Planned Unit Development, Phase 1. This property was developed in 2002 under the jurisdiction of Will County and was annexed into the Village in 2008. The former Chili's restaurant closed on December 12, 2024. Below is a list of dates and actions pertinent to this property:

- **April 3, 2002:** Final Plat of Subdivision was recorded with the County (R2002057104)
- **June 25, 2002:** The Conditions, Covenants and Restrictions were recorded with the County (R2002103988)
- **November 25, 2008:** Ordinance 08-060 was approved by the Village ("annexing certain territory") to annex this property into the Village.
- **December 12, 2008:** Ordinance 08-060 "An Ordinance Annexing Certain Territory" was recorded with the County (R2008145759)
- **January 13, 2009:** Plat of Annexation was recorded (R2009004268)
- **July 17, 2025:** Plan Commission workshop for proposed Chase Bank (HG-2515-PUD)
- **August 7, 2025:** Plan Commission public hearing for proposed Chase Bank (HG-2515-PUD). The Plan Commission forwarded a favorable recommendation to the Board by a 4-2 vote for the Major Change to the PUD.
- **September 10, 2025:** Village Board denied the proposed Chase Bank (HG-2515-PUD) by a 4-2 vote.

The applicant is proposing the following general changes to the site and the existing building to accommodate Chase Bank:

1. Altering the on-site traffic circulation, changing drive aisles and removing parking spaces. The number of parking spaces would be decreased from 101 to 49.
2. Adding a 24-hour drive-through use for the ATM.
3. Adding a new driveway connection from the subject property to Graystone Drive to the north, near Discount Tire.
4. Expanding the footprint of the existing building by 192 square feet.
5. Changing the exterior architecture and building materials.

6. Removing a considerable amount of existing vegetation on the site. Most of the removed vegetation is in the form of shrubs, although 6 mature trees would be removed.
7. Adding a sidewalk connection from the front of the building to the existing sidewalk along Bell Road. This sidewalk staddles the subject property and the right-of-way of Bell Road.
8. Relocating the existing transformer and dumpster enclosure along the rear of the building. A new trash enclosure would be relocated further away from the building (further from Bell Road).
9. Removing and replacing all of the existing light poles.

According to the applicant's engineer, the existing building is 5,559 square feet. After the proposed 192 square foot building addition for the ATM, the building would have a gross floor area of 5,751 square feet. Due to the reconfiguration of the lot and loss of parking spaces, the impervious surface on the lot would be *decreased* from 49,971 SF to 42,609 SF, or a decrease of 14.7%.

### **Site Improvement Plans:**

#### **Traffic & Pedestrian Circulation**

The site would be modified for use as a bank instead of a restaurant. The main changes to the site include adding a drive-through lane for an ATM in the rear of the building facing away from Bell Road, removing 52 parking spaces mostly on the east side of the site, adding a new driveway connection to Graystone Drive to the north next to Discount Tire and widening landscape islands. Graystone Drive is a 30' wide dedicated ingress/egress easement on private property and is not dedicated right-of-way.

The proposed ATM would be in service 24-hours per day. §220-711(A)(11) notes that normal business hours are from 6 am – 11 pm. Operation outside of these hours may be approved as a special use.

#### **Parking**

The applicant is proposing to reduce the number of on-site parking spaces from 101 to 49 (removal of 52 spaces). This parking space removal is necessary in part to accommodate the proposed drive-through for the ATM. Banks are classified as a "business establishment" and require 4 parking spaces per 1,000 square feet of gross floor area. The proposed building would measure 5,751 square feet, requiring 24 parking spaces (including at least 1 ADA-accessible space). The proposed 49 parking spaces after the parking lot configuration meets and exceeds this code requirement. Drive-through uses require on-site queuing for at least 3 waiting vehicles, which has been provided.

It should be noted that the existing front row of parking adjacent to Bell Road is located within a required 30' landscape setback. An exception is being request to maintain this existing row of parking, since the parking lot in general would be modified.

#### **Landscaping**

The traffic circulation on site will change considerably. As part of this reconfiguration, almost all of the existing shrubs and 6 mature trees would be removed. The applicant is proposing replacement shrubs and trees, although they would be naturally much smaller when first planted. The landscape requirements still exceed the code and the applicant worked with staff to try to minimize the amount of existing landscaping removed, which had resulted in the loss of more mature trees. Some of the mature trees would be lost due to the new access drive to the north.

## Signage

The applicant is proposing a new ground sign, wall signs and directional signs (ground-mounted). The proposed ground sign for Chase would replace the former ground sign for Chili's in the same location. This ground sign would contain both the Chase name and logo, as well as include an internally-illuminated blue stripe between the sign face and the masonry base. The proposed signage mostly complies with the Zoning Ordinance, although 1 exception (variance) to the code would be required (explained below).

The applicant is proposing 3 wall signs on the building on the west (Bell Road), north and east sides. The proposed wall sign on the east side of the building is not permitted because it faces a residential zone district, per Table B(4) under §220-1005(B)(4). The sign code also prohibits any wall signs facing a residential district from being illuminated. Wall sign "B03" on the sign plan therefore requires an exception (variance) to be placed on the east side of the building facing the "Square at Goodings Grove" townhomes. However, this east side wall sign would be non-illuminated, unlike the wall signs on the west and north sides of the building.

## Lighting

The applicant is proposing to remove and replace all of the existing light poles and building-mounted lights. The locations of the new light poles would also change from their existing locations. All proposed lights would be LED. The Photometric Plan has been reviewed by the Village's lighting consultant, Farnsworth Group, and complies with all but one Village requirement. §75-55(A) of the Code notes that the gross emission of light shall be less than 100,000 lumens per acre. The area around the proposed ATM exceeds this amount. However, per the Illinois Automated Teller Machine Security Act 205 ILCS 695/1, a minimum number of foot candles are required around ATMs. Section § 75-58(B) of the Village Code states that lighting required by Village, county, state, or federal law, including single-purpose emergency egress lighting on the building is exempt from our Lighting Ordinance and no variance is required.

## Fire Protection

The subject property lies within the Northwest Homer Fire Protection District. The Fire District did not have any outstanding concerns with the plans and a firetruck would be able to circumnavigate the site.

## **Planned Unit Development (Major Change to a PUD):**

The proposed changes to this property constitute a Major Change to the PUD, as defined under §220-903(C)(1) of the Code. Major Changes to a PUD require review by the Plan Commission as a public hearing and final action by the Village Board. PUD changes are a vehicle to grant exceptions to the Code, otherwise known as variances. To offset the requested exceptions, the development should offer other benefits, known as "amenities". Staff has addressed the requested exceptions below and also provided a list of *potential* amenities that help offset the exceptions.

### PUD Exceptions Requested:

1. Permit the encroachment of 13 parking spaces within the required 25' front yard (§220-1002(H)(8)).
2. Permit the encroachment of 13 parking spaces within the required 30' front yard landscape setback (§220, Attachment 2, Table 2B).

- The non-illuminated wall sign on the east façade is not permitted because it faces a residential district, per Table B(4) under §220-1005(B)(4).

**Amenities:** Amenities that exceed Code requirements are required to help offset the impact of an increase in zoning intensity and the granting of Special Use Permits and exceptions to the Village Code. *Potential* incremental improvements for this project include:

- Although existing trees and shrubs would be removed, the Landscape Plan illustrates landscaping that exceeding the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance.
- Reducing the amount of impervious surface on the property by removing 52 parking spaces.

**Conformance with Zoning Regulations**

The existing building structure would largely stay the same, except for the addition of 192 square feet for the ATM. Most of the changes would occur to the site, outside of the building.

**Findings of Fact**

Section 220-1209(D) of the Code of the Village of Homer Glen states the required Findings of Fact for special use permits. The Code requires that the Plan Commission consider these standards in making its finding and determining a recommendation to send to the Village Board.

The 10 Findings of Fact for special use permits are:

- The establishment, maintenance or operation of the special use will not be detrimental to, or endanger, the public health, safety, morals, comfort or general welfare.
- The proposed use at the proposed location will not have an undue or substantial adverse effect, above and beyond that inherently associated with such use, irrespective of the location in the particular zoning district, upon adjacent property, or the character of the neighborhood.
- The special use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood.
- The proposed use at the particular location is deemed necessary for the public convenience and the gain to the public and all or a part of the community exceeds the hardship imposed upon the property owner.

5. The proposed use is generally suitable for the particular zoning district and will not adversely affect development of adjacent properties in accord with the applicable district regulations.
6. The establishment of the special use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of the surrounding property for uses permitted in the district.
7. The adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and/or necessary facilities have been or are being provided.
8. Adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide ingress and egress so designed as to minimize traffic congestion in the public streets.
9. The proposed use has been considered in relation to the location, goals and objectives of the Village's Comprehensive Plan and is in general accord with the guidelines of the plan.
10. The special use shall, in all other respects, conform to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located, including planned developments, except as such regulations may, in each instance, be modified by the Village Board, pursuant to the recommendations of the Plan Commission.

### **Conformance with other Village Regulations**

**Exterior Construction Standards (Chapter 75, Article II):** The Exterior Construction Standards for brick or stone do apply to this project. Most, but not all, of the existing cultured stone veneer would remain on the building and the existing fiber cement paneling would be replaced with differently-colored fiber cement paneling.

**Lighting (Chapter 75, Article II):** The Lighting regulations do apply to this request. The existing 6 light poles around the perimeter of the property would be removed and replaced with 9 new light poles that would be located closer to the building. The Photometric Plan and manufacturer specifications have been reviewed and approved by the Village's lighting consultant, Farnsworth Group.

**Conservation Subdivision (Chapter 107, Article IV):** The Conservation Subdivision regulations do not apply to this request because these regulations only pertain to residential development.

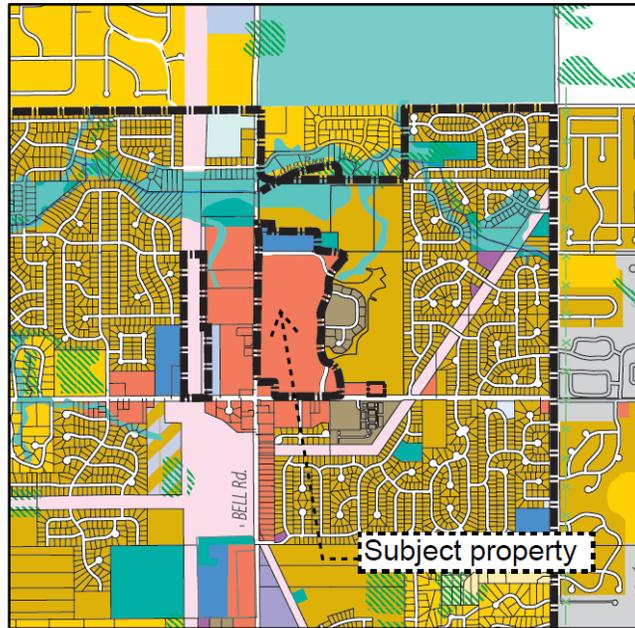
**Tree Preservation (Chapter 107, Article III):** The Tree Preservation regulations do not apply to this request as the property is under 5 acres in size.

**Subdivision & Stormwater (Chapter 138, Article I):** The Subdivision regulations do not apply to this request as the applicant has not proposed the division of the subject property at this time.

**Park Donation (Chapter 138, Article II):** The Park Donation regulations do not apply to this request as these regulations only apply when the Final Plat for a residential subdivision or development has been approved, or when the Final Plat for a Planned Unit Development has been approved.

### **Conformance with Adopted Plans**

**Comprehensive Land Use Plan:** The Comprehensive Plan designates the subject property as Commercial. The special use permit requests for commercial uses are consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Homer Glen, Will County, Illinois (the “Village”) is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the “Home Rule Powers”); and,

**WHEREAS**, an application has been filed by Christopher J Sanz for [1] a special use for a major change to a PUD with exceptions, [2] a special use for drive-through , [3] a special use for 24-hour operation, and [4] site improvement plans for certain real property located in the C-3 General Business zone district at 14025 S. Bell Road, Homer Glen, Illinois; and,

**WHEREAS**, the real property to which the application and this Ordinance relate (“Subject Property”), is commonly known as 14025 S. Bell Road, Homer Glen, Illinois (16-05-01-301-026-0000) and is legally described in Exhibit A, attached hereto; and,

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to a public notice published in a newspaper of general circulation within the Village as required by the Code of the Village of Homer Glen, the Plan Commission of the Village held a public hearing with regard to said application on December 4, 2025, and rendered its findings of fact and recommendations to the Board of Trustees of the Village; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Plan Commission, after due consideration of the staff report, issues, exhibits, and testimony, made findings of fact which are incorporated into the record of its proceedings which are attached hereto as Exhibit B, and recommended approval of [1] a special use for a major change to a PUD, [2] a special use for a drive-through, [3] a special use for 24-hour operation and, [4] site improvement plans for certain real property located in the C-3 General Business zone district at 14025 S. Bell Road, Homer Glen, Illinois; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Village President and Board of Trustees carefully considered public commentary, the recommendations of the Plan Commission, the Village’s staff report, the applicant’s submittals, and the exhibits and testimony provided at the public hearing, all of which are incorporated into the record of its proceedings; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Village President and Board of Trustees, after due consideration have determined that conditionally approving[1] a special use for a major change to a PUD, [2] a special use for a drive-through, [3] a special use for 24-hour operation use and, [4] site improvement plans for certain real property located in the C-3 General Business zone district at 14025 S. Bell Road, Homer Glen, Illinois, is in conformance with the Village’s Comprehensive Plan and in the best interests of the public health, safety and welfare of the Village’s residents.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Village President and Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Homer Glen, Will County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

**Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals.** That the recitals and findings set forth above, and within the Plan Commission’s findings as set forth in Exhibit B, are incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein, and are expressly adopted as recitals and factual findings of the Village Board.

**Section 2. Special Use Permits.** The Village hereby conditionally approves [1] a special use for a major change to a PUD, [2] a special use for a drive-through, [3] a special use for 24-hour operation for certain real property located in the C-3 General Business zone district at 14025 S. Bell Road, Homer Glen, Illinois (16-05-01-301-026-0000), with certain exceptions:

1. Permit the encroachment of 13 parking spaces within the required 25-foot front yard,
2. Permit the encroachment of 13 parking spaces within the required 30-foot front yard landscape setback, and,
3. Permit a wall sign on the east side of the building per the submitted plans.

**Section 3. Site Improvement Plan Approval.** The Village hereby conditionally approves the Site Improvement Plan for the subject property.

**Section 3.1. Conditions.** The conditional approvals in Sections 2 and 3 above, are subject to the following express conditions:

1. Meet all final engineering and building code requirements.
2. All landscape areas shall have living ground cover or mulch, as noted per the Landscape Plan. There shall be no use of stone or gravel as the top layer of landscaping material.

**Section 4. Severability.** The various portions of this Ordinance are hereby expressly declared to be severable, and the invalidity of any such portion of this Ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other portions of this Ordinance, which shall be enforced to the fullest extent possible.

**Section 5. Repealer.** All Ordinances or portions of Ordinances previously passed or adopted by the Village of Homer Glen that conflict with or are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

**Section 6. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

**Section 7. Notice to Applicant.** That the Village Clerk is further directed to forward a copy of this Ordinance to the applicant as notification of the passage and approval of this Ordinance.

another \$10,000 to the project. Hewas agreeable to adjusting the striping for the ADA spots.

Chairman Hand clarified with the applicant that he would remove more than the actual footprint of the pavement removal. The applicant stated he would. Mr. Hand didn't understand the relevance of making the asphalt removal a part of the condition.

The applicant stated he will be removing 170 feet of asphalt to accommodate the sign, which will have a brick base up to a certain height to make it look classy, and then the sign. They will fill in around the base with dirt and plant flowers.

The Commissioners discussed the landscaping as a code requirement, and restriping the handicap spots would be a requirement.

There was discussion about the brightness of the sign, but our code doesn't address any internal sign lighting as it is not considered a luminaire.

No other discussion on this matter.

*A motion to close the public hearing made by Commissioner Foley, seconded by Commissioner Marshall. All were in favor, zero (0) opposed. The motion carried.*

Golden Oak Dr. Homer Glen, Illinois [HG-2520-V]. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lyons. A roll call vote was taken with Commissioners Foley, Lyons, Mesaf, Stanly, Marshall and Chairman Hand all voting in favor six (6) to zero (0). The motion carried.*

*Commissioner Foley made another motion to recommend approval with conditions of a Variance to permit a ground sign as an obstruction in the required clear vision triangular area for certain real property located in the C-1 neighborhood commercial Zoning District at the common address 14322 S Golden Oak Dr. Homer Glen, Illinois [HG-2520-V], adding the Condition is to stripe two (2) handicap parking stalls per ADA requirements that are 11 feet wide with a five (5) foot loading space. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Stanly. A roll call vote was taken with Commissioners Foley, Stanly, Marshall, Mesaf, Lyons and Chairman Hand voting in favor six (6) to zero (0). The motion passed unanimously.*

- d) **Case No. HG-2515-PUD, 14025 S. Bell Road – Chase Bank (Workshop):** A request for [1] a Major Change to the PUD with exceptions, [2] a Special Use for a drive-through use, [3] a Special Use 24-hour operation, and [4] Site Improvement Plans for

certain real property located at 14025 S. Bell Road, Homer Glen, Illinois. (PIN: 16-05-01-301-026-0000)

Director Gruba explained the request. No public comment has been received yet for this project, perhaps because the public hearing notices haven't been mailed to all property owners within 250' and a notice of public hearing has not been placed in the newspaper because this is a workshop, not a public hearing.

He presented the site plan and the (9) major changes: (a) Altering the on-site traffic circulation. Parking spaces would reduce from 101 to 49. (b) Adding a 24-hour drive through for the ATM. (c) Adding a new driveway connection from the subject property to Graystone Drive to the north near Discount Tire, (d) Expanding the footprint of the existing building by 161 square feet, (e) Changing the exterior architecture and materials, (f) Removing a considerable amount of existing plants which includes shrubs and six (6) large, mature trees, (g) Adding a sidewalk connection from the front of the building to the existing sidewalk along Bell Road, (h) Relocating the existing transformer and dumpster enclosure at the rear of the building and (i) Removing and replacing all of the existing light poles. This is an overview of all of the changes being proposed.

The Fire District will be able to navigate the parking lot with a fire truck per their review. Director Gruba presented the landscape removal plan.

The applicant did work with staff to maintain as many of the mature trees as possible. The gable roof above the main entrance would be replaced with a flat roof, per staff's recommendation, and they would keep the cultured stone veneer. The existing brown fiber cement panels would be replaced with ash-colored fiber cement panels. The wall proposed wall sconce lights would shine downward. All sides of the building as it would look were presented. The Photometric Plan complies with the Village's lighting regulations, with the exception of the lighting around the ATM. However, there is a state law that specifies minimum lighting levels around ATM's, but this minimum level exceeds the Village's lighting regulations. As such, a variance or exception to the PUD would be required for this lighting. Four (4) new wall signs were proposed. Staff recommended that Chase Bank remove the Chase name and logo from the directional signs and the applicant agreed to do so. The wall sign on the east façade that faces a residential zone district would not be illuminated, as required per code. A floor plan was provided, showing a large open and unused portion of the building and the applicant is present and will explain the purpose for this. A traffic memo was provided to staff which noted that the amount of traffic anticipated could be adequately supported by Bell Road and the internal drive aisles within Gooding's Grove.

Director Gruba stated that in case this Special Use for a Major PUD Change should not be granted, it should be based on at least one of the findings of fact, or standards for variances. This is not a public hearing tonight, but in the future, if there is any future vote, this should be kept in mind.

Applicant Jon Krissoff approached the podium and explained that the existing Chase Bank location within Jewel-Osco is one of the last in-store banks. Chase Bank has been looking to move to a stand-alone location and they have been closing down the in-store branches. Closing the branch in the Jewel would leave a big hole. The stand-alone banks do much better and that is why they are closing the in-store kind. People prefer the privacy of an office for discussions. He said that the traffic will be very predictable and will not be as busy as Discount Tire across the way.

Commissioner Foley said that he likes the plan, and feels the Village needs this.

Commissioner Marshall asked a question about the traffic. He was trying to think about peak hours. The applicant said that banks are busy more during commuting hours, morning before work or after work. During the day there are the occasional appointments. Bank hours are likely going to be nine (9) to five (5) but they can double check that – all locations are not the same. It could be six (6) pm. They will check and get back to us.

The traffic study shows more traffic than the restaurant that was there. The bank land use in the manual overestimates the amount of traffic generated. This land use will not generate what is showing up on paper.

Chairman Hand asked if they had data for pedestrian traffic inside the Jewel, wondering if this free-standing bank would double the current in-store traffic. The Chase team did not have that information.

The Commission discussed the scale of service in the Jewel Chase, which will be limited compared to what the free-standing locations offer.

The excess space inside the former Chili's building would be filled at a later time, or remain storage, it has not yet been determined. Commissioner Stanly asked if they were aware that the location where the Arby's is now was a bank that sat vacant for a long time. The Chase representatives stated they were aware, but they felt they were too far out of the prime area and far from their competitors and therefore, not interested. They were happy to hear that this location opened up.

Chairman Hand said that the sentiment of the Village is that we need restaurants, and that it was a sad day for us when Chili's closed.

A full-service drive through will not be provided as they find they are not needed like before. ATM machines do so much now and for this location, they feel only 1 ATM machine will be needed. ATM's can now do what the tellers can do. They want people to come inside the bank, Chase likes the personal touch and for people to come inside. Fewer or no teller lines is becoming the norm. At some point they may discontinue and decommission drive throughs completely.

There will be a small overhanging roof over the drive up for the ATM.

Commissioner Marshall asked Director Gruba if the Economic Development Department has an opinion on this project at this location. Director Gruba said that the Economic Development Department believes that this may not be the highest and best use for this property, primarily because banks do not tend to generate synergy with other retail businesses and banks do not generate retail sales. Commissioner Marshall asked if any other parties were interested in the Chili's property, such as for retailers or a different restaurant. Director Gruba said that he wasn't sure. Commissioner Marshall said that they would be giving up a retail-generating space and he doesn't know that it would be good for the community, in that respect. The applicant stated that the location in the Jewel doesn't see much "B2B" (Business to Business) work, but they feel that with the free-standing store, with Home Depot and Meijer anchors behind, they would see more B2B which would be good for more economic development.

Commissioner Foley asked why the vacant Purple Onion has not been picked up for a restaurant, and staff explained that that this building is located on 143<sup>rd</sup> and not Bell Road and that the building has other issues that need addressing.

Commissioner Hand stated the current condition of the former Chili's parking lot is in bad shape and the applicant said he would contact the holding company and let them know.

Director Gruba asked the Commissioners to go through the discussion topics to summarize their thoughts:

- 1) Overall use of the property for a bank: The Commission did not voice any further concerns.
- 2) The proposed drive-through use in this location: The Commission did not voice any further concerns.
- 3) The proposed 24-hour ATM use: The Commission did not voice any further concerns.
- 4) The removal of parking spaces. It was noted that the number of parking spaces would be reduced by about half and the Commission did not have any concerns about this.
- 5) The changing of on-site traffic circulation, including the proposed new driveway access to Greystone Drive: The Commission noted that it would be preferable to add the additional entrance/exit in this location.
- 6) The removal of some existing trees and shrubs and planting new landscaping. No comments from the Commission.
- 7) Signage: The Commission noted that it would be preferable if the directional signs were internally illuminated, and agreed that the wall sign on the east elevation should not be illuminated. The applicant noted that Chase does not internally illuminate directional signs by trade. Rather, entrances would be illuminated by light poles so the internally lit signs are not necessary. The south facing wall sign would require a variance (exception) because it does not face a "public street or private circulation road". The existing ground sign would be retrofitted for Chase Bank.
- 8) Changes to the existing light poles: No comments from the Commission.

Director Gruba said that it sounded like the Commission was not recommending any changes to the plans except maybe the Sign Plan. Staff confirmed that there aren't any landscape requirements except for parking lot islands.

Commissioner Foley said he can see both sides of the argument for whether the building should be repurposed as a bank instead of a retail space or a restaurant.

Planner Udarbe said her only concern is the loss of parking and if the use should ever revert back to a restaurant, then the parking spaces would have to be reinstalled.

Staff will dig into whether the wall sign on the east façade facing the residential townhomes could be illuminated or not, or whether it would be allowed at all per code.

The next step after this is a public hearing. If there are no major changes to the plan, it could be quickly turned-around to bring it back to the Plan Commission as a public hearing on August 7<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioner Lyons asked if a public hearing sign could be added on the back side of the property, not just the Bell Road sign, to maximize awareness of the public hearing. The applicant agreed to this.

*Commissioner Foley made a motion to approve with conditions, of a Variance to permit a multitenant sign with nine (9) tenant panels where no more than six (6) are permitted for certain real property located in the C-2 Local Business Zoning District at the common address 15741 S. Bell Road, Homer Glen, Illinois, [HG-2522-V] subject to the following conditions:*

- a. Sign Panel for “oil change” not permitted per code. Panel would have to be black, blank or the name of the business.*
- b. if all 9 tenant panels are not used but businesses within the plaza, the must be replaced with black panels.*
- c. Tuffy’s wall sign must be removed per code and wall restored to original condition.*
- d. All businesses must be registered with the Village and in good standing with the Secretary of State.*

*The motion was seconded by Commissioner McGary. A roll call vote was taken with Commissioners Foley, McGary, Marshall, Lyons, Stanly and Chairman Hand all voting in favor six (6) to zero (0). The motion passed unanimously.*

*Commissioner Foley made a motion to recommend approval of a Variance to increase the permitted sign face area for a multitenant sign from the permitted 120 to 146 square feet for certain real property located in the C-2 Local Business Zoning District at the common address 15741 S Bell Road, Homer Glen, Illinois [HG-2522-V]. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Stanly. A roll call vote was taken with Commissioners Foley, Stanly, Lyons, Marshall, McGary and Chairman Hand all voting in favor six (6) to zero (0). The motion passed unanimously.*

*Finally, Commissioner Foley made a motion to adopt the applicant’s findings as the findings of the Plan Commission. This motion was seconded by Commissioner McGary. A roll call vote was taken with Commissioners Foley, McGary, Marshall, Stanly, Lyons and Chairman Hand all voting in favor six (6) to zero (0). The motion passed unanimously and will go before the Village Board on August 27, 2025.*

**b) Case No. HG-2515-PUD, 14025 S. Bell Road – Chase Bank (Public Hearing):** A request for approval of [1] a Major Change to a PUD with exceptions, [2] a Special Use for a drive-through use, [3] a Special Use for a 24-hour operation, and [4] Site Improvement Plans for certain real property located in the C-3 General Business District at 14025 S. Bell Road, Homer Glen, Illinois. (PINs: 16-05-01-301-026-0000)

Director Gruba presented the background of this case. He explained there was a workshop meeting and very few changes were recommended. Chase Bank is proposing to use the old Chili’s restaurant for a Chase Bank. There are four (4) entitlements that would be required: A major change to the existing PUD with exceptions, a Special Use for a drive through use, a Special use for 24- hour operations and site improvement plans.

The current footprint is 5,559 square feet and the proposed addition would add 192 square feet for a total of 5,751 square feet.

There was some public comment. On July 22, 2025, staff was contacted by a representative of Domino’s Pizza asking if the building would be subdivided into smaller retail spaces. Also, on August 1, 2025, staff was contacted by a resident who inquired if the building was still for sale.

The main changes to the plan were that the wall sign was removed on the south facing wall to comply with code and the wall sign on the ATM itself on the East side of the building was removed to comply with code. Other than that, there have not been any substantial changes.

Director Gruba discussed some of the site plan slides and presented the changes being proposed. There were nine (9) general proposed changes as part of the conversion from Chili's to Chase Bank.

- 1) Altering the on-site traffic pattern
- 2) Adding the drive thru use for the 24-hour ATM
- 3) Adding a driveway connection to Graystone
- 4) Expanding the footprint of the building for the ATM by 192 square feet
- 5) Some architectural changes to the exterior
- 6) 6 large trees and multiple shrubs would be removed. Some new trees and shrubs would be planted.
- 7) Adding a sidewalk connection from the front of the building to the existing sidewalk along Bell Road.
- 8) Relocating the existing transformer and trash enclosure
- 9) Removing and replacing all existing light poles

Director Gruba discussed additional slides and described them to the public, which included the traffic and pedestrian circulation explaining it would be modified for bank use versus a restaurant. He indicated that the Fire Department completed their review and they didn't have any concerns. He presented that there was a Photometric Plan and it was reviewed, and it does meet code with the exception of the lighting by the ATM machine, but that lighting meets state code/law and the Village lighting regulations would not apply in this instance.

He discussed the exceptions which started out as five (5) in all, but after discussion, it is down to only four (4).

1. Permit the continuance of undersized parking spaces of 9' by 18' is 9' by 19' is required. This situation was created by the County a long time ago. However, since the parking lot would be altered, the undersized parking spaces would require an exception as part of the Major Change to the PUD.
2. Permit the encroachment of 13 parking spaces within the required 25' front yard, being the spaces along Bell Road.
3. Permit the encroachment of 13 parking spaces within the required 30' front yard landscape setback, being the spaces along Bell Road.
4. The wall sign on the east façade is not permitted because it faces a residential district.

He presented discussion topics for the Plan Commissioners and concluded presentation.

Commissioner Hand asked for a motion to open the public hearing.

Commissioner Stanly made a motion to open the public hearing, seconded by Commissioner Lyons. All were in favor, zero (0) opposed, the motion carried.

Applicant Jon Krissoff with Chase Bank introduced himself and stated that the Chase Bank branch within Jewel-Osco is one of the last in-store locations. They offer less services than they would in a stand-alone bank. They are excited to bring this here. He stated at the in-store location, people are doing more bank transfer, deposit, withdraw types of transactions. You don't see a lot of business loan type banking at this type of branch, or opening new accounts. Chili's was closing whether Chase Bank was coming or not. He stated they did not displace Chili's. He stated that bringing Chase would bring an economic lift to the community. He said he would answer any questions.

For public comment, a resident named Joseph Martin approached and asked if there is a commitment from the bank and said he is concerned there will be another vacant bank. He added banks don't bring in sales tax revenue. He would like to see another restaurant. He asked if the one in the store would close. Chairman Hand said that they believed that the property has not been sold to Chase Bank as of yet. He further added that Chase Bank is not intending to keep the branch and will close the Chase Bank location within Jewel-Osco. The resident asked if the Plan Commission and the Board do not approve it, does this matter come to a close and Chairman Hand indicated it was his understanding that they would not then be allowed to move in to that Chili's space, if that were the case.

Bill Burke said his question was already answered, and stated that he wanted to know if the Jewel branch would close, in which case it would.

Resident and Trustee Reynders spoke to discuss the struggles with the operating within the Jewel branch, as a Chase customer. She stated it is always full and there isn't any privacy. She doesn't want to see the building remain vacant. A free-standing bank would be great; you can take care of your business this way. She added as a Village Trustee, she too wants to see that the Village is secure and she would like a revenue generating business, but she doesn't want to see a vacant building. She stated that the Purple Onion has been vacant for five (5) years, and she believes the Chili's has been vacant for over a year now and she said that vacancy brings struggle. She would prefer that something goes in there. We have tried to locate restaurants to fill that spot and we could not do it. To have a full, free-standing bank would be great. She feels it will be good for the community all the way around.

Commissioner Foley stated he agrees with Trustee Reynders. He said he doesn't want to see it sit empty, he is a Chase customer, and he drives to Lockport to bank at a stand-alone bank.

Commissioner McGary stated that two (2) weeks ahead of Chili's closing, she was there at Chili's, and it was already out there that the Chase was locked in on this property, and with that being out there, why would others express interest. She doesn't feel we need another bank. She would have liked what could have gone in there, before it was locked in.

Commissioner Stanly agreed with Commissioner McGary. He explained we have 7 banks within walking distance of each other. If Chase is all we can get, then that is what it is. But he would prefer to see something else.

Commissioner Marshall said he struggles with this and feels we have moved into the on-line transactional period, and he is not understanding how another bank helps that purpose especially as that location is critical to our Village. He is concerned about our tax revenue dollars. He doesn't see the financial gain for the Village, he sees customers moving from one location to another. He is challenged by approving this is a bank location. He said that Standard #4 had not

been met for the Special Use Permit Findings of Fact. He does not see this as a gain for the Village over all.

Commissioner Lyons stated she would prefer an occupied building over a vacant building. We cannot force the owner to sell to anyone we prefer. She said that based on the workshop, they have been looking in the Village for a long time. Chase doesn't want to leave the Village; they just want to leave the Jewel. She said Bell Road is like a "Bankers Row". It doesn't generate tax revenue like other options but a vacancy isn't great. She noticed that the over growth was cleaned up. Regarding the East elevation, the Chase sign being not-illuminated facing the residential units would still need an exception as the code also states there cannot be a wall sign on a residential side.

Most of the businesses along Bell Road have wall signs there but they were in place prior to the MI Homes residential project. They were abutting commercial property at that time.

Commissioner McGary stated she wanted to be clear that she wasn't implying that Chase should not have a stand-alone bank, but that particular property, she feels, would better service our community as a restaurant or something along that line.

Jon from Chase stated that they had looked for a long time, and they were looking for something that would work for them. That location was their target. He said they want to add more business to the Village.

Commissioner Hand asked if they looked at the empty banks at 143<sup>rd</sup> and Wolf Road. Jon with Chase said they like to have the anchor stores behind them, with the Home Depot and Meijer. The empty 1,300 square feet within the proposed Chase Bank would eventually be used by Chase Bank, not another tenant. But the use for the empty 1,300 square feet has not been determined at this time.

Commissioner Marshall asked about business-to-business growth and more mortgages being processed and asked Jon to provide more information as to how that would help the community. Jon stated they provide tools and loans to customers, that those loans get invested, and there is a multiplier effect, which provides an economic lift. That is how a retail bank makes money. They make projections on a pro-forma basis. He said there is other space around for more businesses to come near Menards.

Commissioner Hand stated that the community was surprised to see Chili's close. He does have concern with letting it sit empty. The costs of opening restaurants are getting extreme. He said he did count banks in the area. We would not be adding a bank really, unless a new bank would like to occupy the Jewel area. He said in a perfect world, we would have retail or another restaurant. But an occupied building is better than a vacant building.

Lauren, the civil engineer approached, and she stated that they did bring the parking into compliance. The curbs were being replaced, and as part of the redevelopment, they will bring the stalls into compliance. The perimeter curb around the sight, but the curb and sidewalk around the building has been adjusted. With that update, there are only (3) exceptions now. Director Gruba confirmed that he overlooked that the parking stalls were in fact increased in size after the workshop meeting, from 9'x18' to 9'x19', and therefore complied with Code.

Director Gruba said that if any of the Commissioners were going to vote against the Major Change to the PUD or the other two special use permit requests, those Commissioners should

state which Findings of Fact were not being met, per the Commissioner training. The Commissioners understood.

Chairman Hand asked for a motion to close the public hearing.

*Commissioner McGary made a motion to close the public hearing, seconded by Commissioner Stanly. All were in favor, zero (0) opposed. The motion carried.*

*Commissioner Foley made a motion to recommend approval with conditions of a Major Change to PUD with exceptions (a) Permit the encroachment of 13 parking spaces within the required 25-foot front yard; (b) Permit the encroachment of 13 parking spaced within the required thirty front yard landscape setback; and (c) Permit a wall sign on the east façade per the submitted plans, for certain real property located at 10425 S Bell Road. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Marshall. A roll call vote was taken with Commissioners Foley, Lyons, McGary and Chairman Hand voting in favor, and Commissioners Marshall and Stanly voting in opposition citing item 4 from the PUD Findings of Fact. The motion carried in a four (4) to two (2) vote.*

*Commissioner Foley made a motion to recommend approval of a special use permit for a drive-through use, for certain real property located at 14025 S Bell Road. Commissioner McGary seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken with Commissioners Foley, McGary, Marshall, Lyons and Chairman Hand all voting in favor, and Commissioner Stanly voting in opposition, citing item 4 from the PUD Findings of Fact. The motion carried in a five (5) to one (1) vote.*

*Commissioner Foley made a motion to recommend approval of a special use permit for 24-hour operation for certain real property located at 14025 S Bell Road. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lyons. A roll call vote was taken with Commissioners Foley, Lyons, Marshall, McGary and Chairman Hand all voting in favor, and Commissioner Stanly voting in opposition citing item 4 from the PUD Findings of Fact. The motion carried in a five (5) to one (1) vote.*

*Commissioner Foley made a motion to recommend approval of Site Improvement Plans for certain real property located at 14025 S Bell Road. The motion was seconded by Commissioner McGary. A roll call vote was taken with Commissioners Foley, McGary, Marshall, Lyons and Chairman Hand all voting in favor and Commissioner Stanly voting in opposition citing item 4 from the PUD Standards. The motion carried with a five (5) to one (1) vote.*

*Commissioner Foley made a motion to adopt the applicant's findings as the findings of the Plan Commission. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Lyons. A roll call vote was taken with Commissioners Foley, Lyons, McGary, Marshall and Chairman Hand all voting in favor, and Commissioner Stanly voting in opposition citing item 4 from the PUD Standards. The motion carried with a five (5) to one (1) vote.*

This item will go before the Board at a date to be determined.

## **9. Village Board and Committee Updates**

Director Gruba discussed the Board's action on previous cases that came before the Plan Commission.

Old Oak Park was completed, and the ribbon cutting is on August 13<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

He discussed some other developments in the pipeline regarding two (2) Dunkin locations.

**L. LEGISLATION AND ACTION ITEMS**

1. Consider for Approval a reimbursement grant award under the Commercial Building Improvement Grant Program to FE Properties LLC (owner of Fischer Plaza) for eligible improvements at 14322 S Golden Oak Drive in the amount of \$7,500.00.

Trustee Reynders motioned to approve, Trustee Mason second.

Discussion – Trustee Lepore stated that he has a business interest in that plaza so he will abstain.

*The Mayor asked the Clerk to call the Roll:*

2. Consider for Approval an Ordinance granting [1] a Major Change to a PUD with exceptions, [2] a Special Use for a drive-through use, [3] a Special Use 24-hour operation, and [4] Site Improvement Plans for certain real property located in the C-3 General Business District at 14025 S. Bell Road, Homer Glen, Illinois (PIN: 16-05-01-301-026-0000) [HG-2515-PUD].

Trustee Reynders motioned to approve, Trustee Lepore second.

Discussion – Trustee Reynders – feels there is misinformation regarding why Chase is looking to locate their services to this location. Trustee Reynders stated that Chase bank has been in Homer Glen (inside Jewel) since 1996. Their current space is too small and Chase would like to expand its customer base. The old Chili’s building has been vacant for three years, no tenants attracted due to the high rent. She feels that denying Chase would be a “disservice” to an established business.

Trustee Lepore – stated that most residents he spoke to oppose this project and he spoke about the loss of sales tax revenue. He mentioned that half of the building would sit vacant under Chase’s plan and that the view is “short-sighted,” and “lazy.”

Trustee Mason – echoed residents’ concerns of “do we really need another bank?” He also feels a better use of the building is possible.

Trustee Muller – loves the look of the renderings but agrees with Trustee Mason and Lepore. Feels the location is too valuable for a bank and would prefer something that attracts broader traffic.

Trustee Schaller – acknowledges the potential of commercial benefits. He is concerned about traffic, zoning, environmental quality, and neighborhood character. Trustee Schaller recommends denial until more refinement of the plan and community input.

Trustee Holzhauser – has a mixed stance. Noted that residents are pro business but tired of empty buildings. He points out that a past closed bank was repurposed successfully into an Arby's. Trustee Holzhauser would like to hear directly from Chase reps before making his final decision.

Trustee Mason motion to suspend the rules so Chase Bank representatives could address the Trustees, second by Trustee Muller.

The Mayor did not vote.

The motion carried.

Discussion – Chase Bank Market director, John Kristoff spoke. Also present was property owner, Norman Burmeister, zoning counsel, regional director of operations, the civil engineer and architect. Mr. Kristoff stated that Chase intends to invest nearly eight million dollars into the property to create a state-of-the-art facility. He went on to say that the economic benefits would be increased property value and property taxes. Another economic benefit would be the indirect boost to local sales tax by increasing customer traffic and lending activity. They would be able to extend banking services for residents. He mentioned that while initially not using the whole building due to staff size, Chase does eventually expect to use all space as demand grows. He also emphasized that the proposal is not a choice between a restaurant or a bank. Data provided showed Homer Glen already has fifty-four restaurants. Chili's had underperformed at the site and the seller is unlikely to find a better deal. Chase views the site as a prime location and wants to invest significantly, and sees its presence as a way to raise overall economic activity.

Mr. Burmeister put together a small summary. The original lease was with GE Capital to Brinker which is the parent company to Chili's. He purchased the property in February 2020 for \$2,950,000 cash. At that time, the tenant was paying \$259,256 a year in rent which gave an 8.8% return. There was a renegotiation of the lease around 2022, where Chili's reported losses but ultimately they wanted to exit the lease. Lease ended on February 13, 2025 instead of the expiration date of December 31, 2027. Chili's paid a termination fee of \$328,715. They could not market the building while Chil's occupied it.

Trustee Reynders – reminded everyone that Chase is an existing business in Homer Glen, not a new bank. The bank that has been serving the community since 1996 – nearly 29 years of business.

Trustee Lepore – noted that while there are 54 restaurants in the area, the majority are fast food establishments. He emphasized that what residents are asking for are more sit-down restaurants. He further expressed that framing the issue as “Chase or nothing” is short-sighted.

Discussion – Attorney Pasquinelli gave a brief explanation.

Trustee Lepore motioned to approve, Trustee Muller second.

Discussion – after much discussion they felt this needed to go back to A&F to explore other fee options.

Trustee Mason made a motion to table, second by Trustee Reynders.

**1. Call to Order.**

The meeting was called to order at 7pm by Chairman Hand.

**2. Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.** The Pledge was led by Commissioner Mesaf.

**3. Roll Call.**

Members present: Commissioner Foley, Chairman Hand, Commissioner Foley, Commissioner Marshall, Commissioner Stanly, Commissioner Mesaf, and Vice Chair McGary

Also present were Planning Director Gruba, Assistant Planner Kahn, and Economic Development Director Patch.

**4. Approval of Amendments to the Agenda**

None.

**5. Approval of the Agenda**

Not called because there were no changes to the agenda.

**6. Minutes.**

- a) **November 20, 2025:** Commissioner Marshall made a motion to approve the minutes from November 20, 2025, which was seconded by Commissioner Mesaf. A voice vote was taken, all were in favor, zero (0) opposed and the motion carried.

**7. Public Comment.**

Commissioner Hand asked if there was anyone that wanted to speak on anything that was not on the agenda. There were none.

**8. New Business and Possible Action**

- a) **HG-2529-PUD, Public Hearing for Chase Bank:** Consider a request for approval of **[1]** a Major Change to a PUD with exceptions, **[2]** a Special Use for a drive-through use, **[3]** a Special Use for a 24-hour operation, and **[4]** Site Improvement Plans for certain real property located in the C-3 General Business District at 14025 S. Bell Road, Homer Glen, Illinois.

Director Gruba shared that this is the same application as submitted earlier in the year. Director Gruba gave an overview of the four motions. The project was denied by the Village Board 4-2 on September 10, 2025; there is no waiting time to reapply for a Special Use Permit or Major Change to the PUD unlike a Zoning Request where you have to wait a year to reapply. The applicant reapplied, paid the application fee, and posted the public hearing sign.

There is no public comment so far. Director Gruba mentioned how commissioners can vote differently from the previous vote and can vote to approve one motion but not another.

If commissioners vote no, they must state the standards for findings of fact. If PC gives 4 yes votes, this goes to the Board and the Board has to approve the plans with a simple majority. If the Plan Commission gives an unfavorable vote, then the Board would need 5 votes to pass the project.

Director Gruba showed the survey of the site, an aerial photo, and the proposed site plan for Chase Bank (without changes to project from the original request). Applicant would be altering

on-site traffic circulation, changing the drive aisles, removing parking spaces, adding 24-hr drive-through use for the ATM, adding a driveway connection, expanding footprint of building by 192 sf with ATM addition, changing exterior architecture and building materials, removing considerable amount of vegetation on the site (including shrubs and 6 mature trees) while replacing with new landscaping, adding sidewalk, relocating existing transforming and dumpster enclosure farther from building, and removing and replacing all existing light poles.

The firetruck can circumnavigate the site. No comments from the fire department.

Director Gruba showed the landscape removal plan with 6 mature trees removed.

Director Gruba said that the applicant would keep most of stone veneer on the building but would change out the fiber cement panels with a different color. They would also add black aluminum accent features with the canopy and trim of the building. No architecture plans have changed since the last request.

Director Gruba showed the lighting plan that removes 6 light poles and the installation of 9 new light poles.

The 3 PUD Exceptions that are being requested are:

1. Permit the encroachment of 13 parking spaces within the required 25' front yard (§220-1002H)(8).
2. Permit the encroachment of 13 parking spaces within the required 30' front yard landscape setback (§220, Attachment 2, Table 2B).
1. The non-illuminated wall sign on the east façade is not permitted because it faces a residential district, per Table B(4) under §220-1005(B)(4).

Director Gruba walked through the signage with 2 illuminated wall signs and 1 non-illuminated wall sign. The ground sign would be in same location as the Chili's and would be illuminated.

Two separate floorplans were submitted that are slightly different with the bathroom configuration. Planning staff intends to defer to the architectural floor plans and not the floorplan submitted with the sign package.

*Commissioner Stanly made a motion to open the public hearing, seconded by Commissioner Lyons. A voice vote was taken, all voting in favor, zero (0) opposed. The public hearing was opened.*

**Petitioner Comment:**

Jon Krissoff, the Market Director of Real Estate for Chase Bank, explained that they were denied at the Board 4-2. They have not purchased the property yet. He mentioned that they have an in-store bank in the Jewel that does not provide privacy. Mr. Krissoff said they don't open new accounts. They have zero investments and zero small business lending and banking. There are no financial advisors. It's a transaction branch, and he said that they have low transactions at that location. The sub-lease expiration with Jewel is at the end of this year, and they have one 5-year option left. Mr. Krissoff said they want to invest in community since they have a lot of customers. Other locations nearby are successful. They looked at other locations that were also restaurants that were not controversial.

The branch isn't doing business or deepening relationships or doing lending currently. Mr. Krissoff mentioned that bank use is permitted by-right, and they could move in without all the variances

or PUD exceptions. Mr. Krissoff wanted to redo the application with the Board knowing that they intend to move forward for Chase to invest in Homer Glen. He wants to have the conversation again knowing that they will still move forward without all the PUD Exceptions and Special Uses. Mr. Krissoff said that this is an \$8 million business case. Mr. Krissoff mentioned that it would be an economic lift, but they don't provide direct sales tax revenue that a restaurant would have.

Chairman Hand asked if there is any public comment. There was none.

**Plan Commission Discussion:**

Chairman Hand had a few questions. Chairman Hand asked if they don't do any of the improvements, what would they do for improvements with the landscaping and parking? Director Gruba stated after this was last denied by the Board on September 10<sup>th</sup>, staff reached out to the applicants and said that a bank use by itself is permitted by-right in this Zone District. If Chase Bank elected, they would be permitted to update the façade of the building, but no changes could be made to the site plan, parking lot, or lot poles, as these would have triggered a Major PUD Change. In other words, Chase Bank could still occupy the building by-right as long as no changes were proposed outside the building and the footprint was not expanded for an ATM. Chairman Hand asked if the building would be improved at all. Mr. Krissoff mentioned that they'd build out of the offices inside but they wouldn't do the rest (landscaping, drive-up, connection to the north) if the special use permit requests were again denied by the Board. Mr. Krissoff mentioned that they will still be able to have Chase signage without variance.

Director Gruba mentioned that the exterior could be changed for the building façade without the need for a special use permit, but that's about it. Commissioner Lyons asked further about how the ATM can't be added. Director Gruba said that the building addition for the ATM would require a special use permit for a Major Change to the PUD by changing the site plan.

Chairman Hand asked if this is still denied, they can go in by-right, but they can request the same special use permits for a third time in the future with a separate case.

Commissioner Foley asked why the Board had denied the special use permit requests on September 10<sup>th</sup>. Commissioner McGary said that the Board preferred to have a restaurant.

Commissioner Marshall mentioned how Chase jumped onto the building on day 1. He asked if any other companies had the opportunity to offer a bid. Mr. Krissoff mentioned that Chili's was on investment channels. Mr. Krissoff said that the owner had shared that Chili's paid a high rent. Chairman Hand mentioned that at the Board meeting the property owner wanted \$250,000 per year for a lease. Commissioner Marshall asked staff if there are any interested parties for this property.

Economic Development Director Janie Patch mentioned that the Village knew confidentially that Brinker International was closing the Chili's about a month before it happened. Within 1 week, the Village received a call from Chase's hired architect with all the plans for Chase. So, the deal was already done at the time that the Chili's was closing. The listing was marketed to the investment community. The listing wasn't trying to find a new tenant publicly; it was trying to find a new investor who would pick up a triple-net lease, single tenant national brand with a guaranteed income with 4 more years on the lease. The Village has received a lot of calls for interest about a space like that for a second-generation restaurant space of that size, but there wasn't an opportunity to market it that way.

Mr. Krissoff mentioned that the O'Brien Group couldn't publicly market it because Chili's was still running.

Commissioner McGary made a motion to close the public hearing, seconded by Commissioner Marshall. A voice vote was taken, all voting in favor, zero (0) opposed. The public hearing was closed.

Motions for Consideration

1. Commissioner Foley made a motion to recommend approval, seconded by Commissioner McGary, of a Major Change to a PUD **with exceptions and conditions** [listed below] for certain real property located at 14025 S. Bell Road. The motion passed unanimously, 7-0.
2. Commissioner Foley made a motion to recommend approval, seconded by Commissioner McGary, of a special use permit for a drive-through use, for certain real property located at 14025 S. Bell Road. The motion passed unanimously, 7-0.
3. Commissioner Foley made a motion to recommend approval, seconded by Commissioner McGary, of a special use permit for 24-hour operation for certain real property located at 14025 S. Bell Road. The motion passed unanimously, 7-0.
4. Commissioner Foley made a motion to recommend approval, seconded by Commissioner McGary, of Site Improvement Plans for certain real property located at 14025 S. Bell Road. The motion passed unanimously, 7-0.

PUD Exceptions

1. Permit the encroachment of 13 parking spaces within the required 25' front yard (§220-1002H)(8).
2. Permit the encroachment of 13 parking spaces within the required 30' front yard landscape setback (§220, Attachment 2, Table 2B).
3. The non-illuminated wall sign on the east façade is not permitted because it faces a residential district, per Table B(4) under §220-1005(B)(4).

PUD Conditions

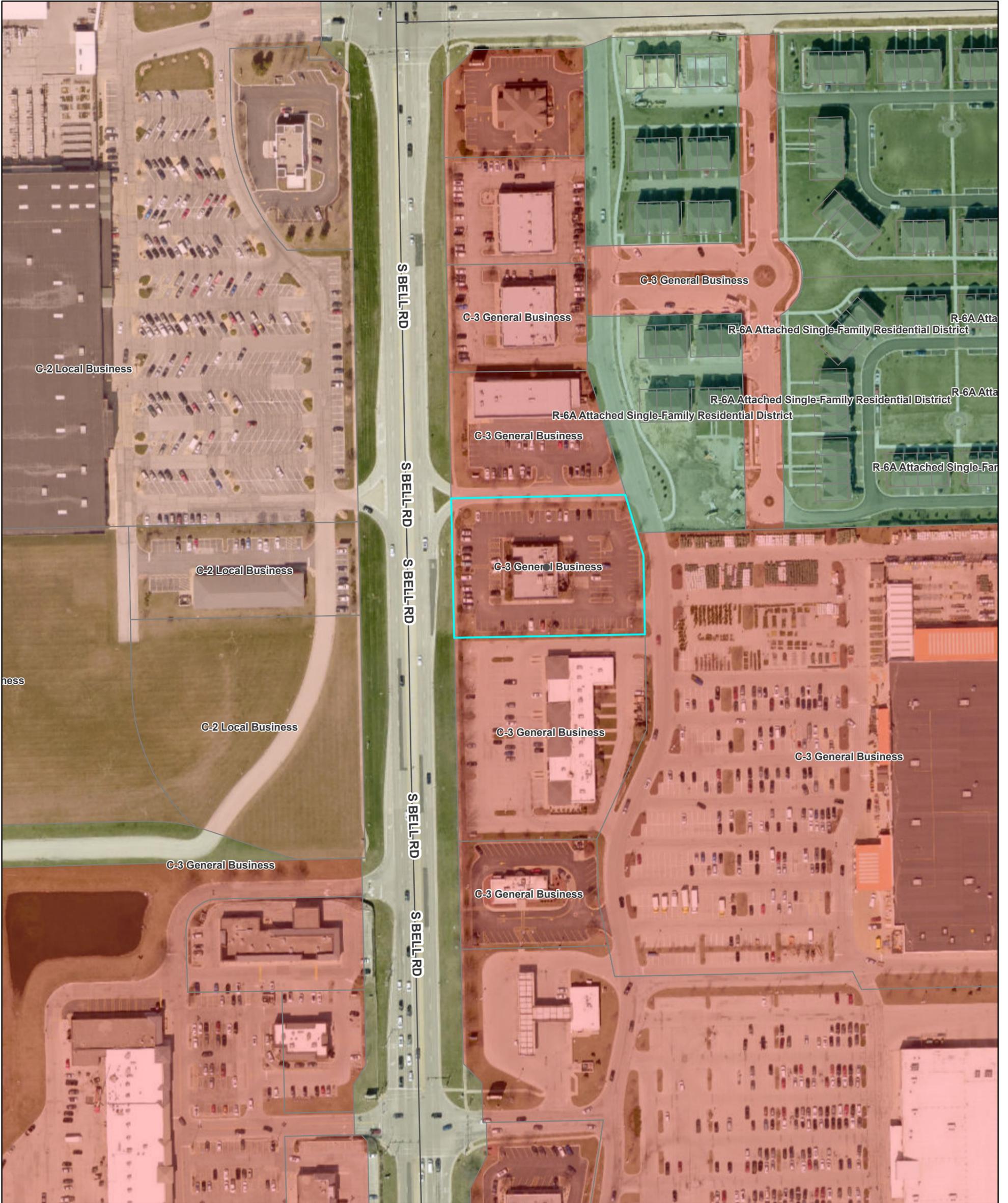
1. Meet all final engineering and building code requirements, including Final Plat submittal.
2. All landscape areas shall have living ground cover or mulch, as noted per the Landscape Plan. There shall be no use of stone or gravel as the top layer of landscaping material.

Commissioner Foley made a motion to recommend approval of findings of facts, seconded by Commissioner McGary, for [1] a Major Change to a PUD with exceptions, [2] a Special Use for a drive-through use, [3] a Special Use for a 24-hour operation, and [4] Site Improvement Plans for certain real property located in the C-3 General Business District at 14025 S. Bell Road, Homer Glen, Illinois [HG-2529-PUD]. The motion carries, 7-0.

This case will go to the Village Board on Wednesday, Jan 14, 2025 for a final action.

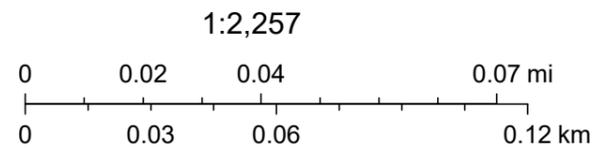

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## INTRODUCTION

On behalf of JPMorgan Chase, Kimley-Horn has prepared a trip generation comparison for the proposed Chase Bank to be located at 14025 S Bell Road, in the southeast quadrant of the S Bell Road and Greystone Drive intersection in Homer Glen, Illinois. This memorandum outlines the comparison of trips generated for the proposed Chase Bank versus the Chili’s sit-down restaurant previously on-site.

### Existing Conditions

The existing Chili’s sit-down restaurant on the subject site provides approximately 5,722 square feet (SF) of restaurant space with 101 parking spaces including five ADA accessible parking spaces. The site currently includes one full access driveway along Greystone Drive in the southeast corner of the property. An aerial view of the existing site is included in **Exhibit 1**.

### Proposed Chase Bank

The proposed Chase Bank redevelopment would largely re-use the existing building structure with 5,643 SF of space and slight modifications to accommodate a drive-thru ATM and after-hour depository located on the east side of the building. No teller services are planned via the drive-thru. The drive-thru ATM is planned to operate with one-way northbound circulation and would provide a bypass lane and stacking space for approximately 4-5 vehicles. 49 parking spaces, including 2 ADA accessible parking spaces, will be provided on-site. The existing full access driveway along Greystone Drive will be maintained. One new full access driveway is proposed along the northern frontage of the site with the portion of Greystone Drive that is oriented east-west and connects with S Bell Road. This proposed access would be opposite the existing full access with Discount Tire. The proposed site plan is shown in **Exhibit 1** for comparison with an existing aerial image of the site.

## TRIP GENERATION AND ACCESS

### Land-Use Determination

In order to compare trips generated by the existing and proposed site, data was referenced from the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) Trip Generation Manual, 11th Edition. Land Use Codes (LUC) 932 – High-Turnover Sit-Down Restaurant and LUC 912 – Drive-in Bank were selected to determine appropriate trip generation estimates for the existing and proposed conditions, respectively.

### Trip Generation Estimates

Trip generation was based on data contained within the ITE Trip Generation Manual, 11th Edition and was estimated by the using the GFA as the independent variable for both the existing LUC 932 and the proposed LUC 912. **Table 1** shows the ITE-projected trip generation for both the existing and proposed facilities.

### Access Review

One new full access driveway is proposed along the northern frontage of the site with the portion of Greystone Drive that is oriented east-west and connects with S Bell Road. This proposed access would be opposite the existing full access with Discount Tire. According to the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) Bureau of Local Roads & Streets and Permit Manuals, high-volume commercial access driveways should be placed at least 100 feet away from the adjacent street (measured from edge of adjacent street to beginning of driveway flare). When measured from the edge of S Bell Road, the beginning flare of the proposed full access driveway is approximately 135 – 140 feet away from S Bell Road. The driveway location exceeds the minimum guidelines established by IDOT, suggesting it should function effectively and have limited impact on vehicles turning to/from S Bell Road and Greystone Drive.

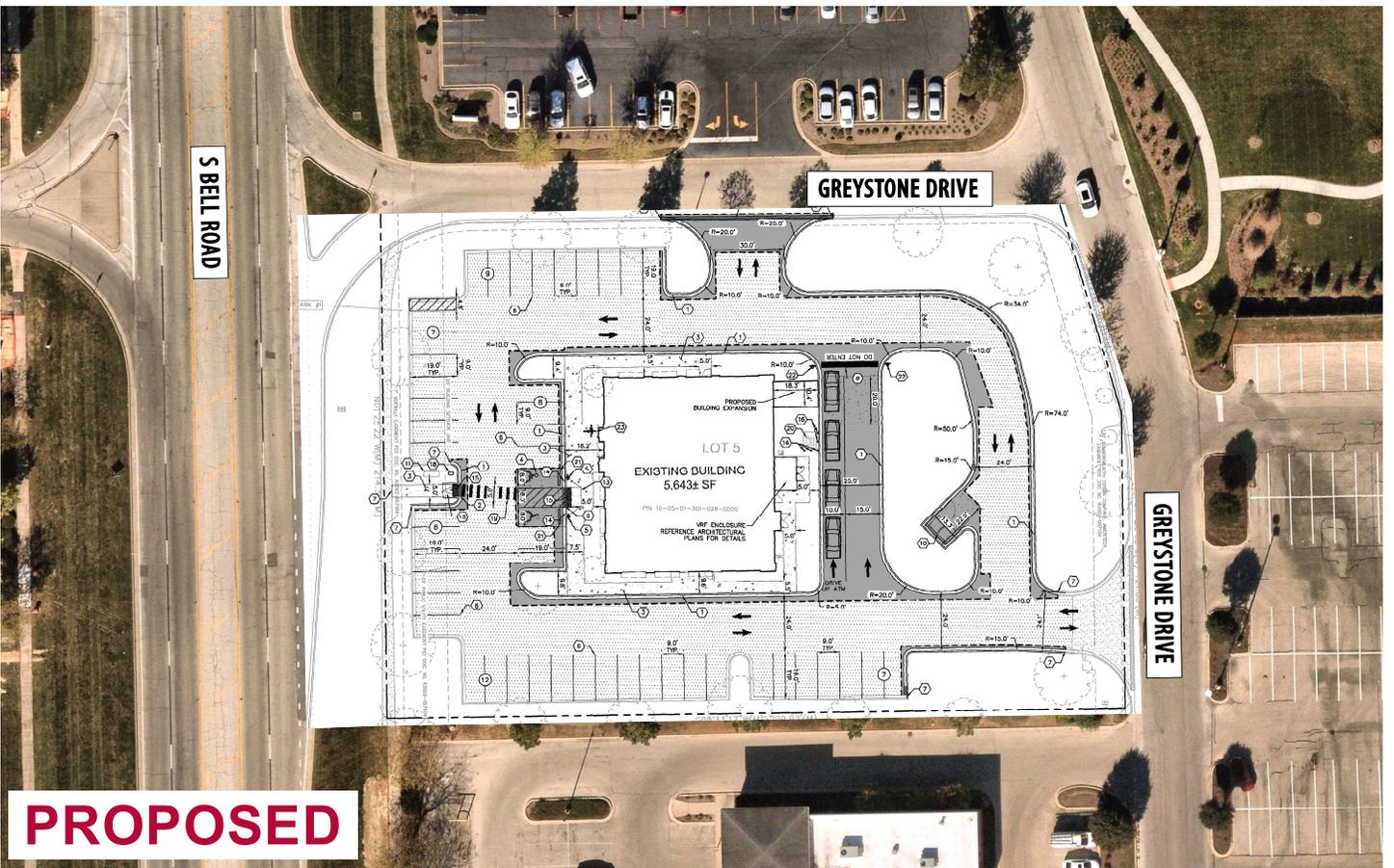
## CONCLUSION

The proposed Chase Bank redevelopment would largely re-use the existing Chili's building structure with 5,643 SF of space and slight modifications to accommodate a drive-thru ATM located on the east side of the building. 49 parking spaces, including 2 ADA accessible parking spaces, will be provided on-site. The existing full access driveway along Greystone Drive will be maintained. One new full access driveway is proposed along the northern frontage of the site with the portion of Greystone Drive that is oriented east-west and connects with S Bell Road. The new full access driveway is located approximately 135 – 140 feet away from S Bell Road, which exceeds the minimum spacing guidelines (100 feet) established by IDOT.

According to ITE trip generation estimates, the redevelopment could generate 40 fewer trips during the typical weekday, approximately the same number of trips during the weekday morning peak hour, 70 more trips during the weekday evening peak hour, and 85 more trips during the Saturday midday peak hour. Based on these estimates, the change in site-generated trips following the redevelopment of the subject site does not necessitate any modifications along S Bell Road or Greystone Drive. The adjacent roadways are anticipated to support the site generated traffic.

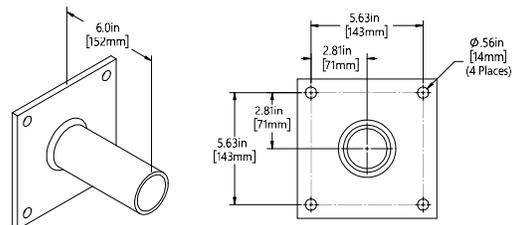


#### Round Pole Mounting Drilling Template

### **Background**

The applicant, FE Properties LLC, owns the subject commercial property in the C-1 Neighborhood Commercial District at the common address of 14322 Golden Oak Drive, commonly known as the Fischer Plaza. The applicant is requesting review and approval of an amended landscape plan for Case HG-2520-V. This sign has been installed and a grant for the project has been approved by the Village Board. Final inspections for the permit and grant reimbursement cannot be completed due to the landscaping not being installed per the approved landscape plan.

### **August 13, 2025 Village Board Meeting:**

An Ordinance granting [1] Variance to permit a multitenant sign with seven (7) tenant panels where no more than six (6) are permitted and [2] a Variance to permit a ground sign as an obstruction in the required clear vision triangular area for certain real property located in the C-1 Neighborhood Commercial Zoning District at the common address 14322 S. Golden Oak Dr, Homer Glen, Illinois [HG-2520-V] was approved at the August 13<sup>th</sup> Village Board meeting.

A Landscape Plan was required as part of the request for the variances. Typically, when variances are approved by the Board, the plans contained therein must be followed. To assist the applicant in completing the variance application process, staff drafted a Landscape Plan (Attachment 2). The plan illustrated an approximate 210 square-foot landscape area around the sign base with 40 plant units which consisted of 10 units of Weigela, 10 units of Spirea, 10 units of Sedum, and 10 units of Switchgrass. This Landscape Plan was based on a similar ground sign that required landscaping, and the applicant signed this plan as acknowledgment, as seen in Attachment 5.

### **Landscape Code Requirements**

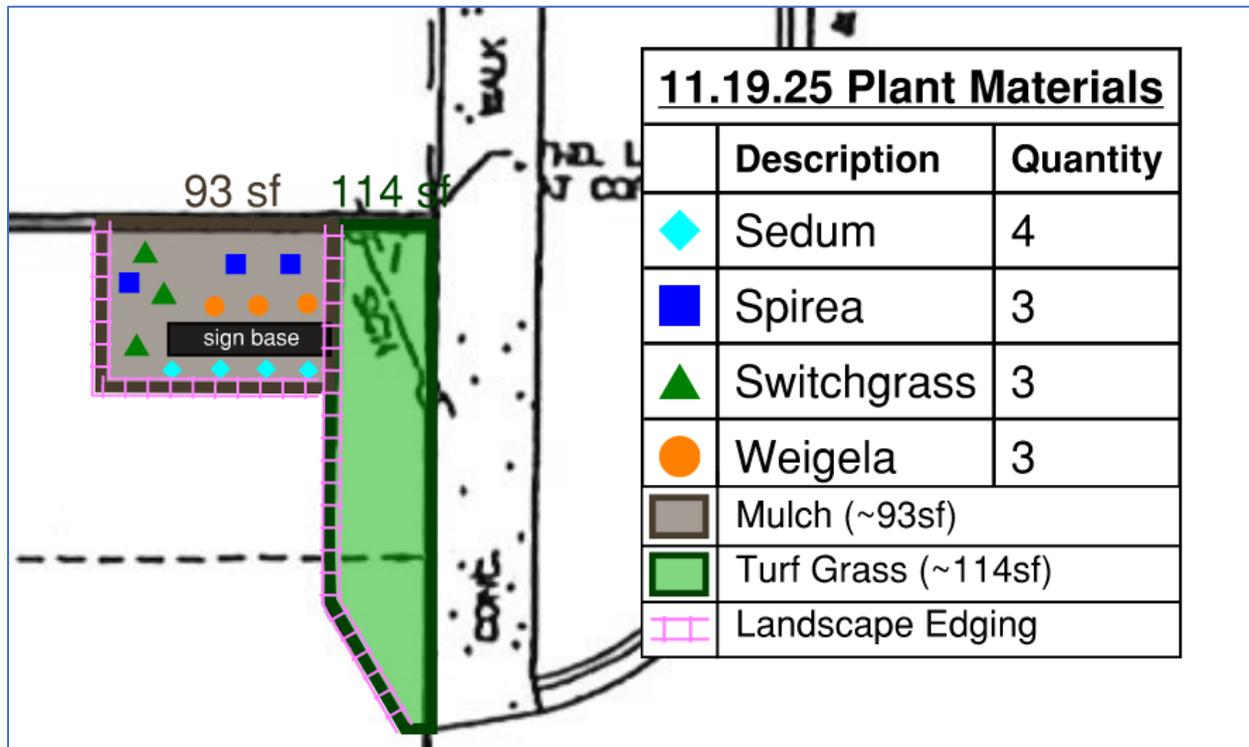
Per code § 220-X-1005B(1)(i), *All permanent ground-mounted signs shall have landscaping at their base equivalent in area to 1 1/2 square feet for every one square foot of area of the sign. The landscaping should have year-round interest and should include shrubs, ornamental grasses and perennials. Sodded or seeded areas shall not qualify as landscaping. The landscaping should*

be large enough to cover or soften the base of the sign without blocking the sign copy. All planting beds shall be mulched with three inches of organic mulch. A landscape plan for ground signs, which will be reviewed administratively, shall be submitted with the associated sign permit. All landscaping shall conform to the clear vision requirements of § 220-808 of the Village Code.

**Landscape Inspection**

Landscape inspections are performed by staff as part of the permit review process. Staff's landscape inspection on 11.19.25 identified 13 plant units (instead of 40), located on three sides of the sign (instead of four). The 13 installed plants included: 3 units of Weigela; 3 units of Spirea; 4 units (2 already mostly consumed by animals) of Sedum, and; 3 units of Switchgrass.

Landscape Inspection:



The aggregate area provided around the sign appears to meet code requirements of at least 168 square-feet, though a portion of the area had not been converted to mulch and had been left as turf grass. Although the code contains a square footage requirement for landscaped area, it does not specify the number of plant units required and instead relies on the Landscape Plan.

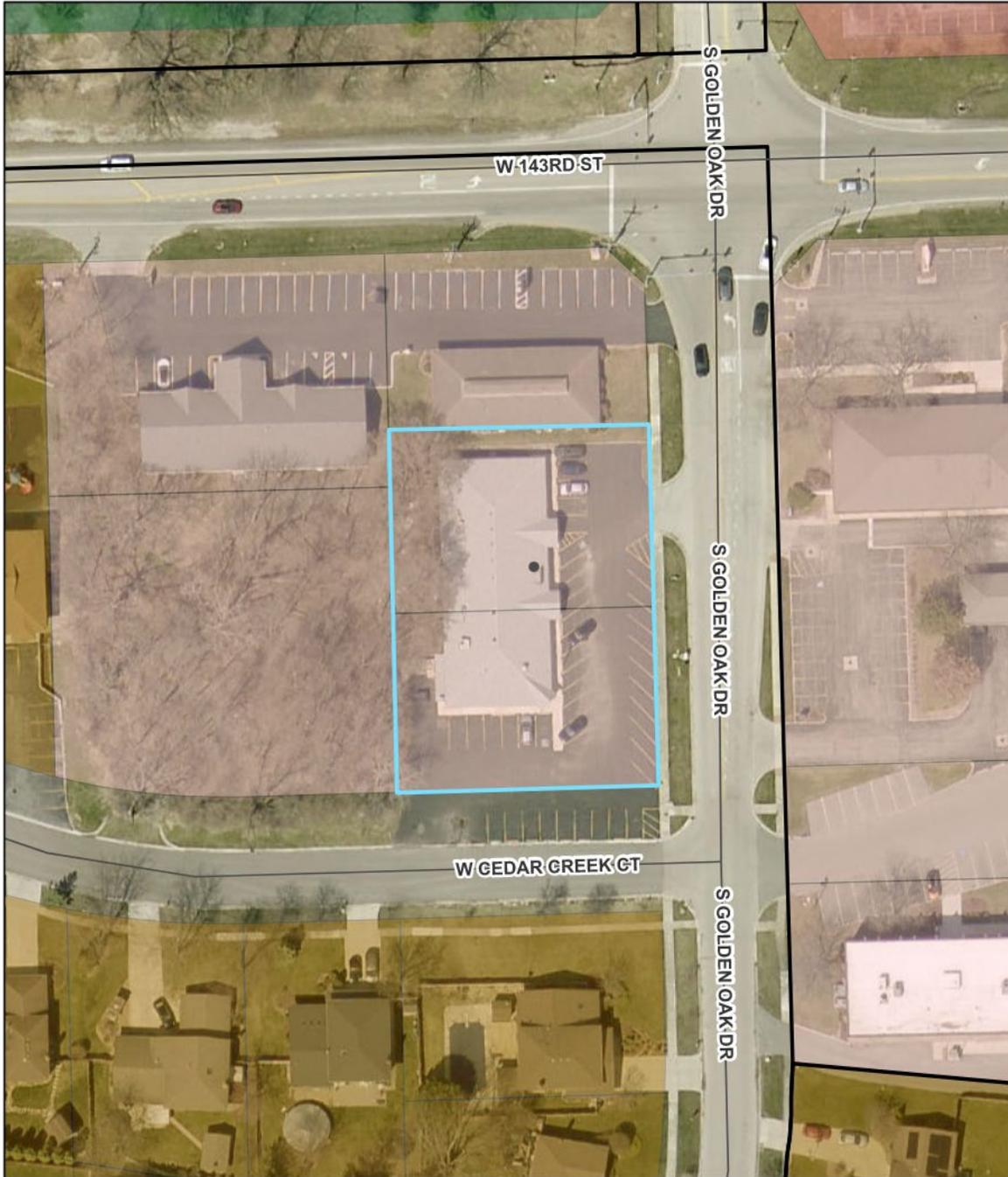

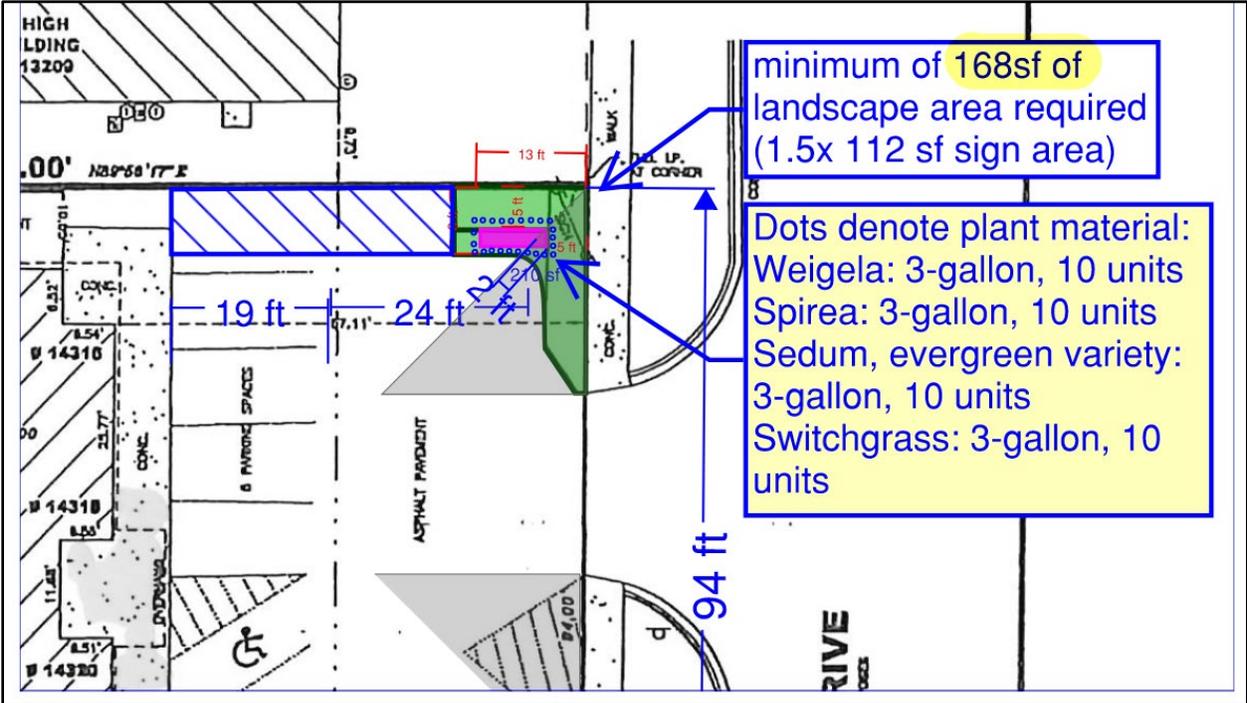

**Background Information:** The Village has a long history of working with Beary Landscaping for the right-of-way maintenance on 159<sup>th</sup> Street. In 2023, the Village purchased mowers to handle servicing the medians and right of way. The safety of Public Works staff was one concern and our staff had limited ability/time to maintain these areas. We went back out to bid following that season, and Beary came in lowest, and has for consecutive bids. They have been responsive to any additional requests without hesitation. The cost for the 2026 season would be the same as it has been for the 2024 and 2025 seasons, which is \$45,000.

In addition to mowing, Beary's services include: manage weed control in the medians, and any gravel areas as well as grassy areas, they are licensed to apply a 3-step herbicide treatment (3) times each season, they do edging, replace mulch as needed to a depth of two (2) to three (3) inches at least once per season to freshen the appearance, seeding as needed and twenty (20) to thirty (30) cuts per year, as permitted by the weather.

**Item Title:** Consider for approval an Ordinance Amending Chapter 69, Animals, of the Code of the Village of Homer Glen.

**Motion for Consideration:** Is there a motion to approve an Ordinance Amending Chapter 69, Animals, of the Code of the Village of Homer Glen?

**Staff Contact:** Code Compliance Officer Ron Kus

**Background Information:** There are two main updates suggested in these amendments. The first changes “dogs running at large prohibited” to “animals running at large prohibited”. Due to the Village’s unique layout and character, Village staff responds to reports of many types of species of animals running at large. These can be dogs, cats, sheep, horses, etc. This is often difficult to enforce due to the current strict ordinance wording of “dogs running at large prohibited”. This change would address that difficulty.

The other proposed change would allow for Village to formally adopt the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act (510 ILCS 70). This would allow staff to have clear authority to investigate and enforce animal welfare standards within the community. While the Act is state law, incorporating it directly into the Village Code would align local ordinances with state requirements, strengthen the Village staff’s ability to address neglect and cruelty cases, and promote consistent enforcement between Village staff, Will County Sheriff’s Department and Will County Animal Control. Currently, the Village relies solely on these two agencies to provide assistance for animal welfare concerns. This change would add a more localized option for enforcement.

Throughout the year, the Building Department has received multiple phone calls referencing the care of domestic animals but there were no violations of the Village’s Code. After staff attended a training, “ Professional Animal Cruelty Investigator” it is their recommendation to make these changes.

**Budget Implications:** None

**Attachments:** Excerpts from the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act (510 ILCS 70) which would apply for Code Enforcement purposes.

(510 ILCS 70/3) (from Ch. 8, par. 703)

Sec. 3. Owner's duties.

(a) Each owner shall provide for each of his or her animals:

- (1) a sufficient quantity of good quality, wholesome food & water
- (2) adequate shelter and protection from the weather;
- (3) veterinary care when needed to prevent suffering;
- (4) humane care and treatment.

(510 ILCS 70/3.01) (from Ch. 8, par. 703.01)

Sec. 3.01. Cruel treatment.

(a) No person or owner may beat, cruelly treat, torment, starve, overwork or otherwise abuse any animal.

(b) No owner may abandon any animal where it may become a public charge or may suffer injury, hunger or exposure.

(c) No owner of a dog or cat that is a companion animal may expose the dog or cat in a manner that places the dog or cat in a life-threatening situation for a prolonged period of time in extreme heat or cold conditions that:

- (1) results in injury to or death of the animal; or
- (2) results in hypothermia, hyperthermia, frostbite,

(c) Nothing in this Section shall prohibit an animal from being impounded in an emergency situation under subsection (b) of Section 12 of this Act.

(c) Nothing in this Section shall prohibit a law enforcement officer from taking temporary custody of a dog or cat that is a companion animal that is exposed in a manner that places the dog or cat in a life-threatening situation for a prolonged period of time in extreme heat or cold conditions that may result in injury or death of the dog or cat or may result in hypothermia, hyperthermia, frostbite, or similar condition. Upon taking temporary custody of the dog or cat under this subsection (c), the law enforcement officer shall attempt to contact the owner of the dog or cat and shall seek emergency veterinary care for the animal as soon as available. The law enforcement officer shall leave information of the location of the dog or cat if the owner cannot be reached. The owner of the dog or cat is responsible for any costs of providing care to the dog or cat.

**Item Title:** Authorization to use vendor rebate and reward funds for employee appreciation expenses.

**Motion for Consideration:** Is there a motion to authorize the use of vendor rebate and reward funds including those from Menards, Quill, Staples, and similar companies to support Village employee appreciation initiatives to be distributed at the sole and exclusive direction of the Village Manager.

**Staff Contact:** Village Manager Joe Baber

**Committee Recommendation:** The Administration and Finance Committee supported this initiative.

**Background:** The Village of Homer Glen regularly receives rebates, rewards, and incentive credits from vendors such as Menards, Quill, Staples, and other similar companies through routine purchasing activities. These rebates accumulate as store credit or reward balances that can only be used with the issuing vendor.

Historically, these funds have been used to offset general supply purchases. Staff is requesting authorization to broaden the allowable use of these rebate and reward funds to include employee appreciation expenses. This would allow the Village to use vendor-issued credits, not taxpayer funds to support approved employee appreciation initiatives, such as small recognition items, staff engagement activities, or other low-cost morale building purchases. The use of these funds would continue to be tracked and reported through standard financial oversight processes.

**Budget Implications:** No impact to the general fund. Employee expenditures would be paid exclusively from accumulated vendor rebate and reward balances.
