A. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order on January 11, 2023 by Mayor Yukich at 7:00 p.m. in the Village Board Room, 14240 W. 151st Street, Homer Glen.

B. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG**C. INVOCATION**

John Walters gave the Invocation.

D. ROLL CALL

Present were Mayor Yukich, Trustees Ruben Pazmino, Jennifer Consolino, Beth Rodgers, Dan Fialko, and Rose Reynders. Trustee Nicole La Ha arrived via zoom at 7:15 p.m. and left at 7:47 p.m. Also present on behalf of the Village were, Village Attorney Eric Hanson, Legislative Counsel Cary Horvath, Director of Planning and Zoning Melissa King, Economic Development Director Janie Patch, Director of Public Works Brent Woods, Assistant to the Village Manager Gia Cassin, Village Manager Carmen Maurella, and Village Clerk Christina Neitzke-Troiike.
A quorum was established.

G. PUBLIC COMMENT –

Dan Slepawic – Mr. Slepawic requested for the Village Board to amend Code 92-71C. This code does not require sidewalks to be shoveled, but code 92-50B states, there should be no obstruction to the sidewalk. Mr. Slepawic stated he sent videos to staff of his current situation with his neighbor. His neighbor is intentionally relocating snow to obstruct neighbors from walking on his sidewalk.

Mr. Shannon – Mr. Shannon stated before he started complaining, he had a question on the Chicken and the Bee Ordinance that was tabled for tonight's meeting. He wanted to know the intent of the Ordinance discussion. If it was intended for the residents with an acre or more, or, if was intended for residents with a quarter of an acre. Trustee Pazmino stated the reason it was tabled was to give the Trustees more time to get more information. Mr. Shannon suggested to scale the setback to 25 feet to give opportunity to residents with a quarter of an area to have chickens and bees as well.

Sharon Sweas – The duties of the Village Board Members are to uphold the Ordinances of the Village and not to keep amending them to appease certain amenities. For example, the Township Office is planning to upgrade their lighting. That lighting falls under the jurisdiction of the Village. The Township plans on using the Com-Ed efficiency program which uses lighting that does not fall under our lighting Ordinance, which will threaten the status of the Village of Homer Glen Dark Sky Community. In 2021 the Village Board members changed the 2017 Ordinance prohibiting gaming in gas stations to protect the revenue stream for restaurants and bars.

Broque Backal – Mr. Backal stated during the last election, when he ran for office, he was offered a donation from Lenny's Gas and Wash and graciously turned down the offer. Mr. Backal stated no favors were asked of him at the time of the donation offer. Mr. Backal felt at some point, some strings may be attached. Mr. Backal alleged Trustee Pazmino of being the money man behind the Village Board. Mr. Backal stated Mr. Steve Balich and Trustee Pazmino took the donation in order to get the candidates they supported elected. The current Ordinance 17-049 that was passed by the Village Board on July 26, 2017 prohibited video gaming at automobile service stations. The current Village Board passed a new Ordinance 21-056 amending sections to the code regarding video gaming. This was a deliberate quid pro quo.

Mike Carlson – Mr. Carlson called Broque Backal a liar. Mr. Carlson stated Trustee Pazmino and the rest of the Village Board is doing a great job and keeping taxes down. This current Board is doing things the previous Board could not get done.

H. REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM MAYOR AND OTHER OFFICERS

Mayor Yukich – Mayor Yukich stated he had no comment.

Trustee Consolino - I hope that everyone had a great holiday season with their family and friends. Happy New Year Homer Glen. I am hopeful that this new year will bring our community closer together so that we can all work together to prosper in these strained economic times. I'd like to report that both the Environment and the Public Safety committees met this month. Environment came up with tentative dates that we're looking to approve for this year's upcoming events with star gazing, little seedlings and land day's cleanup. We discussed the Memorial tree and bench program to honor family and friends of our residents. Most all of our surrounding towns offer this to their communities as well. We would like to bring the program before the Village board this spring. Everyone on our committee is very excited about finally having the ability to possibly offer this to our residents. We're hoping to finish up the final detail for the board's review soon. Public Safety met and we amended some verbiage with SOP #3 regarding chain of command and discussed if there was any need to address our current leaf burning permits. Kudos were given to both our Public Works personnel and EMA volunteers for their work during our first blizzard over the holidays. I would also like to say thank you to the Homer Township Road District as well. Without all of these personnel providing their support services we weathered the storm as best we could with little complaints. We're currently awaiting reports from the Will County Sheriff's Department and we will be using some of this data for the new Community Safeguard subcommittee. Unfortunately, we did not have enough members for quorum this week with the Community Safeguard committee – however, we did develop our mission statement, our purpose and possible task list, so stay tuned.

I know that our Village Manager will be touching base on this issue tonight as well...we have a very serious and scary issue with our garbage situation. In the past few weeks, we have had two garbage trucks catch on fire as a result of our residents throwing out "lithium batteries." The Village has created a social media post, and will be posting information on the Village Website to educate our residents on the proper disposal of all lithium batteries and what products contain the batteries. The Village Manager will try to work with NUWAY garbage disposal to possibly look into stickers to be placed on the garbage cans to better inform and remind residents of what is actually recyclable by NUWAY. I would like to ask that everyone please take the time to review and look up on the measures to properly dispose of lithium batteries. Sadly, this is a very serious and increasing issue. It's not just happening in Homer Glen. Please educate yourselves on these batteries not just to protect our garbage men from harm, but yourself as well. If they can explode in a garbage truck or a garbage facility, they can explode in your home or garbage can as well.

Tonight, I'd also like to personally address the comments that I continue to endure by both Mayor George Yukich, Trustee Beth Rodgers and Clerk Christina Neitzke-Troiike.

In meeting after meeting for the past twenty months, whenever I have stated on the board or provided evidence of misconduct, violations of ordinances or demonstrations of their unethical behavior each of these officials have stated that I was a liar – without any proof. When I make these statements, I provide examples and facts. I've had the Mayor repeatedly call me nasty names, scream at me to shut up and try to intimidate me into silence. I've had the Clerk tell me to "please stop lying about her." I've had a number of their campaign associates get up at public comment and harass me, scream at me and make false allegations. As a result, I cannot safely have my family, or my child attend our Village board meetings. THIS is the price I pay for telling the truth.

Therefore, tonight, I would like to go on record and invite our residents to FOIA my Village emails regarding misconduct by Clerk Neitzke-Troiike, Mayor George Yukich and Trustee Beth Rodgers. Unfortunately, I cannot just share the information out there, unless it is FOIA'd. Once my Village emails are properly FOIA'd, reviewed and probably redacted for legal reasons, they become public information for anyone to see.

We have a very important mayoral and Village board election coming up in April. You have people sitting on this board that are running as candidates in this election. You also have people on this board campaigning for these candidates. I think it's extremely important to have transparency. I've done my best to provide this at nearly every single Village board meeting. It's why I was elected in 2021 over three of George Yukich's incumbent Trustees. **The residents and voters of Homer Glen have a right to see exactly who and what they are voting for.....no matter how many times I have to be called a liar and other derogatory names for putting the truth out there.**

I invite and welcome our Homer Glen residents to FOIA my Village emails TO and FROM these "three" government officials regarding their official misconduct and unethical behavior. This way you can all see for yourselves who exactly is lying. I have a plethora of documentation referencing their misconduct from the first day of my term on May 12th, 2021, through present day. These are the dates I welcome you to FOIA. It's my entire time in office as a Trustee. You should also be able to see my personal FOIA's of these three officials as well. If you're willing to take the time to do the FOIA, you will see the misconduct for yourself.

Anyone can go to our Village website, and you will find the FOIA form to fill out, or you can submit a simple email online to the FOIA officer. Once the FOIA has gone through the proper procedures and has been reviewed, redacted, and approved by our legal counsel.....those emails then become public. This means, that I can publicly post them.....or anyone can publicly post them. "Truth in transparency Homer Glen."

Early voting will start at the end of February. Please do your research on who our candidates are for the election. Please come out and vote. Homer Glen has over 25,000 residents, and normally 2,000 or less voters participate in our local elections. As a result, roughly 8% of our residents control the fate of our local government for 25,000 people. Please register to vote and use your voice to choose who YOU want to for Homer Glen.

Trustee Pazmino – Trustee Pazmino reported for the Behavioral Health Committee. Trustee Pazmino is very excited about this committee coming to fruition as drugs are becoming a pandemic and it needs to be addressed. Trustee Pazmino thanked Joe Baber and others who are helping to move it forward. Trustee Pazmino thanked the Public Works Department for their great job with the snow removal.

Trustee Pazmino wanted to start the new year in a positive way. Trustee Pazmino stated there is no town like Homer Glen and he loves this Village with all his heart and will never leave. One of the ways to make sure Homer Glen stays on the top, is to make sure we can afford to exist. We had to allow Gas and Wash a gaming license to help bring money into our village. The money brought in by Gas and Wash does not go into the pockets of the Trustees, the money brought in by the gaming helps the Village operate so they do not have to go to the residents. Trustee Pazmino stated, there are difficult decisions to make, like gaming, tabaco, and alcohol. Lenny's Gas and Wash is on the outskirts of town. It has no impact on any other business in town. Trustee Pazmino stated what Mr. Backal had stated was completely false and he needs to be reprimanded for it.

Trustee Reynders – Trustee Reynders stated there are statues in the State of Illinois that define what those duties of the Trustees are. It is the Trustee's responsibilities to make laws and to amend laws. That is what the Trustees were elected to do. Trustee Reynders stated she continues to get push back on social media because she does not use her first name. Trustee Reynders stated she is 68 years old and she has never been called Cheryl, she has always been called Rose. Trustee Reynders stated she works pretty hard for this Village and for residents to come after her, day after day because she does not use her first name, she feels those residents have too much time on their hands. Trustee Reynders thanked the administration staff and the Trustees for an amazing job and all of the work they have done in the year of 2022. Trustee Reynders stated she can only anticipate another successful year to move Homer Glen forward.

Senior Committee – Tuesday was another successful Bingo. They are averaging around 100 people per event. This year the Committee is adding a featured speaker before each event to give valuable information to seniors regarding services available. In February, there is a gentleman from Lockport Township veterans. The seniors will be attending a lunch/bingo at Blueberry Hill and in March and the Senior Tea will be at Tazza. The Township website has been updated to reflect the upcoming senior events.

CED – The CED meeting was short and sweet. The Committee reviewed grant options for the program for the businesses and talked about a mechanical grant program, if ever needed. Trustee Reynders stated some businesses are hurting due to inflation and can't afford equipment that they may need, so the Committee is looking into all possibilities. Tomorrow they will be hosting a meeting for the CED subcommittee to review the seven proposals they received for the Town Center.

The parade meeting is also tomorrow. The parade is scheduled for June 24, 2023, with a rain date of June 25, 2023. If there is anyone interested in participating in the parade please contact Trustee Reynders or Township Clerk Vicki Bozen.

Trustee Fialko – Trustee Fialko wished everyone a happy new year and thanked Public works for taking care of the roads.

Trustee Fialko reported for the Fest Committee. As far as the fest, the bands have been secured. A total of twelve bands will be performing, three bands on each date. The Fest Committee tried to take care of local talent first and have dance music at the end. As soon as they have the contracts back, the list of bands will be released. There will be an open stage for the fest. Trustee Fialko encouraged everyone to bring their lawn chairs and blankets.

Trustee Fialko addressed resident Sharon Sweas. Trustee Fialko stated he does not go on Facebook and he does not follow the trolls as he does not have time for that. Trustee Fialko stated the lighting the Township is taking care of is inside. Trustee Fialko stated he wasn't sure if Ms. Sweas missed that part of the meeting, but if she had a question to please address her concerns with the Township as it is not completed yet. Trustee Fialko stated he has never heard of anyone looking into changing the lighting ordinance. Trustee Fialko stated Ms. Sweas racked up a bill with the law firm over \$1,400.00 in FIOA requests. Trustee Fialko stated the public fired her and this Board didn't have anything to do with it.

Trustee Fialko then directed his comments to Mr. Backal. Trustee Fialko stated you can look online and see what donations were made. Trustee Fialko stated he does not know what is wrong with Mr. Backal but Mr. Backal is a bully. Mr. Fialko stated Mr. Backal was dropping four letter words at people including Trustee Fialko himself. Trustee Fialko stated when he became a Trustee he had a possibility of a tax increase in front of him. They took on gaming for Lenny's Gas and Wash because it takes in revenue for the Village. This board rolled up their sleeves to come up with another way to bring in revenue for the residents instead of taxing the residents. Trustee Fialko stated his voting record is open to the public and encouraged everyone to look. Trustee Fialko asked for everyone to work together.

Trustee La Ha -

Trustee Rodgers – The Homer Glen American Legion is hosting a corn beef and cabbage fundraiser on March 19, 2023 from 4:00pm -7:00pm. Trustee Rodgers complimented the Road District for a great job snow plowing. Relative to the FOIA's, she is happy to assist in the FOIA process. Trustee Rodgers stated she is happy to share the documents that have been given from staff to her. Trustee Rodgers stated she feels bad for the Clerk and the Deputy Clerk in the amount of work and time spent on the FOIA's. Trustee Rodgers also stated the amount of money and attorney review costs on these FOIA's are getting out of hand.

Clerk Neitzke – Troike – Clerk Neitzke – Troike agreed with Pazmino with starting the new year off on a more positive note. Clerk Neitzke – Troike stated she did hear during public comment Trustee Reynders and Trustee Pazmino make comments regarding electioneering and asking residents to speak. Clerk Neitzke – Troike stated she has had residents reach out as they wanted to say something at the podium regarding the behavior on the dais. Clerk Neitzke-Troike stated she told them not to as she would be blamed. Clerk Neitzke – Troike stated she agreed with Trustee Fialko that sometimes when you are attacked time after time, you do have to defend yourself. Clerk Neitzke – Troike stated she has been attacked for 2 years on the dais by Trustee Consolino and has not rebutted one time because she does not care to. Clerk Neitzke – Troike asked for everyone to work together as this behavior is an embarrassment to our Village. Clerk Neitzke – Troike stated she has seen a lot of electioneering going on at the dais and understands it is election time as it has been stated.

Village Manager Carmen Maurella – Village Manager Maurella stated the committees are in full swing and he is excited about this upcoming year. Manager Maurella thanked public works for a job well done in regards to clearing the snow on the roads. The Village is facing some problems with cars in the street on snow days. Manager Maurella reminded residents to move their cars if there is a forecast of snow, it would help out the Public Works Department.

The Sports Organization Field/Faculty Usage contracts are up on the website.

The Village is looking for volunteers for any and all upcoming events. This is a great opportunity for high school students looking to complete their community service hours. Manager Maurella stated Trustee Consolino had already touched base on the garbage truck fire, but wanted to remind residents to be cautious of what is thrown in the garbage. The garbage truck fire was extinguished pretty quickly, but could have been prevented.
